Shakespeare Schools Festival is the UK's largest youth drama festival, we work with over 1000 schools and 140 theatres across the country, and we hope you will join us at The Platform Theatre this Autumn to make the 2015 Festival the biggest and best yet!

What is Shakespeare Schools Festival?



SSF is a charity that gives primary, secondary and special schools across the UK the opportunity to perform a 30 minute abridged Shakespeare play on a local, professional stage, alongside other local schools. We provide the training, resources and structure that enables you to direct a cast of up to 30 students to perform your chosen play in a non-competitive, celebratory night of Shakespeare in the Autumn term. This year in Scotland we will host the Festival at the following theatres, the Platform Theatre in Glasgow, The Church Hill Theatre in Edinburgh, Eden Court in Inverness, The Lochgelly Centre in Fife, Falkirk Town Hall and ACT Aberdeen. The performances will be in November, with additional training dates earlier in the year.

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How does Shakespeare Schools Festival benefit my students?

The impact on the young people who participate is profound: Literacy and articulacy are improved by speaking Shakespeare's words. Aspirations are raised by working in a professional environment and seeing hard work reap rewards. **Understanding** of complex emotions and themes is developed by inhabiting Shakespeare's characters.

Confidence is boosted by performing on a professional stage.

Team work is developed by collaborating with fellow cast members and other schools. **Community** is strengthened, with four local schools coming together to perform for friends and family and working together as one big theatrical company.

By involving your students in an exciting project at the beginning of the school year, their engagement in school life and attainment levels for the rest of the year (and beyond) can be transformed.

How much does it cost?

Shakespeare Schools Festival is a charity and subsidises the cost of participation for each school. It costs SSF £1,767 for every school that participates – the school pays a registration fee of £850+VAT and SSF raises the rest. There are lots of ways to help fund that registration fee so do ask for advice or for our fundraising pack.
