To celebrate **Scottish Interfaith Week 2018**, Interfaith Scotland is looking for budding artists to take part in our **'Connecting Generations'** competition. There is a top prize of £50, second prize of £20 and third prize of £10. Winning entries will have their work displayed at the launch of Scottish Interfaith Week taking place at the Town House, Aberdeen on 12th November 2018. You will be invited to attend this event and receive your prizes. Entries are open to individuals and groups of all ages. If a group wins, the prize money is to be shared between the group members. You do not need to be part of a faith group to enter this competition.

What is 'Interfaith'?

Interfaith is when people from different religions and beliefs come together to talk and better understand people from different faiths and backgrounds. It can happen in lots of different ways such as making friends, going along to festival celebrations, visiting different places of worship or volunteering together to help people and the environment. What is 'Scottish Interfaith Week'?

Scottish Interfaith Week is taking place from $11^{th} - 18^{th}$ November 2018. The week gives people an opportunity to plan and attend events that bring local people from different faiths and beliefs together all over Scotland. Each year we have a different theme to the week and this year is 'Connecting Generations'.

Why have we chosen the theme 'Connecting Generations'?

The Scottish Government has declared 2018 to be the Year of Young People. One of the main aims of the year is to develop better understanding, co-operation and respect between generations. Faith communities, community groups and organisations have an important role to play in providing opportunities for people of different generations to dialogue and engage in activities together.

What is the competition about?

We want to encourage people to submit different items on the theme of 'Connecting Generations'. These could include:

- A drawing or painting
- A photo montage
- A poem
- A video or animation

- A piece of writing
- A song
- A piece of music
- A piece of drama

How to Enter

To enter the competition you must complete the entry form. An entry can be submitted by you, or by a group of people. Entries can be submitted by post or you can take a photograph of your artwork, or make a digital file of your music or video and email to <u>admin@interfaithscotland.org</u>.

When we receive all of your submissions they will go to a judging panel who will decide who will be awarded prizes and we will let you know if you have won. The best artistic entries will be displayed at the Launch of Scottish Interfaith Week which takes place on Monday 12^{th} November at the Town House, Aberdeen from 5.30 – 8.30pm. If you have won and have submitted a poem, song or drama you will have the opportunity to perform it at the launch event.
