



Extended Household



Who can form an extended household?



People who live alone can form an extended household with one other household.



A single parent to children who are under the age of 18.



Two adults who are in a relationship but do not live together.



Everyone within the two households become an extended household.



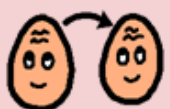
Rules



You can only be part of one extended household.



All adults in household must agree to the extended household.



You must wait 14 days after ending extended household before forming a new one.



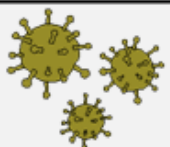
Extended household can stay overnight with one another.



An extended household counts as one when meeting with another household.



If anyone develops symptoms everyone in the extended household must isolate immediately.



If positive result, everyone must isolate for 10 days.



This means stay at home.



Shared parenting allows children to travel between parents homes in all levels. This is not counted as an extended household.
