The wind blew. 'Puff, puff, puff'


Pat face and cheeks and blow. [A hand fan could be used].






The rain fell. 'Tinkle, tinkle, tinkle'.

Stop and hold up your arms and hands.




The bird flew down and found safety in a warm heart. Take hands to heart of the listener and flutter

The wind blew. 'Puff, puff, puff'.


Pat cheeks and blow. [A hand fan could be used.]






The rain fell. 'Tinkle, tinkle, tinkle'.
