Having your voice heard.





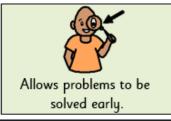
Why is it important?



Helps others understand your needs.









Steps to advocate for yourself.



Know what you need.



Stay calm and be respectful of others.



Clearly state at you need/feel without blaming others.



Listen to others rather than assuming their response.



Ask for help with other options if your first ask is not possible.



Example of Advocacy



You are sitting beside an open window in class. You feel cold. You put your hand up and ask the teacher if you can move seats. The teacher says there are no spare seats in class. You ask if you can put your jacket on instead. The teacher agrees.

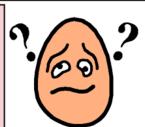

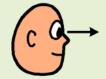
