### PE days

### Homework

This term, homework will focus on preparations for our P7 Leavers' Assembly, with children encouraged to practise their assembly script, dances and learn song words at home.

We would also like to encourage all children to continue reading regularly for enjoyment, choosing a text that interests them. Children are welcome to borrow a book from the school library if they would prefer.

### Our Literacy Learning

In Literacy, our reading focus this term will be on non-fiction texts. Pupils will develop their skimming and scanning skills to help locate key information, summarise important facts and demonstrate their understanding by asking and answering relevant questions.

In writing, we will continue to build on our skills through our Write on Track programme, with a focus on adding more detail and creating increasingly complex sentences. Children will also have lots of opportunities to develop their talking and listening skills through rehearsals and preparation for our upcoming show.



### Other Areas of the Curriculum

French - We will be looking at different sports and being able to describe different sporting events.

HWB - This term we will be working through our RSHP (Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood) lessons as well as looking at Online Safety and Digital Usage.

PE - We will be focussing on our badminton skills as well as fitness.

### Our Numeracy and Mathematics Learning

In Numeracy and Maths, our focus this term will be on angles, symmetry, area and time. Pupils will take part in a variety of practical learning experiences designed to deepen their understanding of these concepts in engaging and meaningful ways. There will be opportunities to work both independently and collaboratively, allowing children to develop and apply a wide range of meta-skills such as problem solving,
