The issue	The team	Our idea	
Giving Infant's a Voice. Health Visitors are integral at ensuring the infants voice is heard. HVs have identified they don't have a tool to promote the infant voice and the parent and infant relationship in the crucial first weeks of life. Parents/carers often report that they don't feel confident to read their baby's cues.	NHS Lothian's Parent and Infant Relationship Service (Infant Mental Health) MDT – Clinical Psychology, Specialist HV, Specialist OT and Therapeutic Social Worker. Working in partnership with HVs in different localities.	To provide HVs with a tool to communicate their observations of the infant within parent infant dyad. Using the tool to increase parents/carers' confidence to read their baby's cues and states. The tool would help build a trusting, therapeutic relationship between HV and parents/carers.	
Tools & resources we used.	What we did	The impact	
Newborn Behavioural Observation Tool (NBO) (Brazleton). Protected CPD time to attend 2-day training course (online). HVs provided with online resources and a textbook with support from PAIRS and Brazleton UK. Websites, videos and literatures to share with families to facilitate effective conversations centring infants' voice.	PAIRS liaised with CNMs and facilitated training for 11 HVs across NHS Lothian. Mix of NES funding and Lothian PAIRS Year 1 underspend. PAIRS provided support to get HVs accredited in NBO. Evaluation of how HVs used the tool including perceived impact, benefits and barriers.	The project is still in its infancy and the impact is being monitored. Benefits: Early feedback is positive – relative to job role, improving communication and therapeutic relationships HVs have all reported benefits including at using the tool during the 6-week check Challenges: Balancing UHVP visits and accreditation requirements	
Our learning & next steps	 Ensuring all HVs achieve accreditation. Continued evaluation. In-depth interviews planned with HVs involved in NBO training.
