Tools & resources we used.	What we did	The impact
We created a suite of resources to send out to settings along with a user's guide on how to set up the room with useful resources and tips for parents which can be recreated easily at home. The main resource was a PowerPoint presentation including references to Mr Tumble and the Scottish Government Parenting Tips web site, along with sign-posts to agencies for support.	Initially we launched these resources at the SLC Head Teacher's meeting asking them to allocate time for this in their improvement plan. We then presented to establishments and sent out resources. After sending out to establishments, both Carol and I ran parental engagement workshops in our settings and supported other members of staff to do the same.	Parental feedback was positive. Many parents and carers were reassured to know that a lot of what we were encouraging was very easy to implement at home. Parents and Carers were very interested in the facts about the benefits of reading with small children.
Our learning 8 next steps	This is an area that will require reinforcement regularly. It is our plan to remind establishments of the resources available at the beginning of each academic year.	
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
