The issue	The team	Our idea
Increasing number of children in ELC who experience barriers to communication. Visuals were used in some settings to support children but there was a lack of consistency across Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) providers and healthcare professionals which was not inclusive for children and their families.	Angus Council Additional Support Needs team and Angus Children and Young Peoples Speech and Language Therapy Service	Create and provide each setting a core set of visuals. Provide structured training to the Early Years Workforce to support implementation. Provide ongoing support and advice.
Tools & resources we used.	What we did What we did	The impact
Board maker was used to created core resources. PDF's of core visuals were issued to settings post training. Staff from Visuals for All Team planned, resourced and implemented training.	Initial visit to a school in Edinburgh using the Visual Support Project (VSP). Trialled Edinburgh VSP in one setting as a test of change. Created an Angus specific training which we called Visuals for All (VFA). Managed the pace of change by initially working with one setting at a time. Progressed to training for staff at In Service training sessions. Staff training was available to all ELC providers across Angus. Shared with parents to support home routines. Shared with wider Angus workforce, including the family nurture support team and social work.	90% of Angus ELC providers implement VFA as a universal approach to support all children. Standardisation of visuals used across Angus Early Years providers and AHPs. Increased confidence in practitioners using a wide range of visuals including lanyards, environmental labels, and whole setting labels. Childrens communication and learning is supported and underpinned by VFA.

Our learning 8 next steps	Our visuals support all children in our ELC providers. Staff benefited from specific training on how to use visuals. Families are beginning to engage with the use of VFA.

	 Launch VFA online module for Angus staff. Review visuals regularly and develop as required e.g., jigs. Continue to support ELC settings to embed the use of VFA. Share training with other professionals.
