





How should I prepare for my first day?

To make sure you have a successful start at Dumfries Academy, the key thing is preparation. You will settle in more easily and confidently if you know that you have everything you need when you arrive at school.


So, make sure you have the correct uniform in plenty of time before your first day. (We will provide your parents/carers with all the information they need.)

Make sure you have a school bag which has room for all your books and equipment. Your equipment should include:

- Pens
- Pencils
- Eraser
- Scientific Calculator

We will provide you with stationery.

Pack your bag the night before, so you aren't in a rush and don't forget anything. This is good practice every day.



On your first day, you will go to the hall, where your teachers will meet you.

Your class buddies (pupils from S3 and S6) will guide you to your form room. Here you will meet your tutor every morning to check how you are. They will always be available during this period to talk to if you ever need help or advice.

Over the first one or two weeks, your buddies will take you to all your classes and to the lunch hall until you feel settled and get to know your way.

We are all very friendly at Dumfries Academy and anyone will be happy to help you. You will soon know where everything is and feel at home!



What happens during the school day?

Every day, you will have seven periods of 45 minutes each and a break and lunchtime. Initially, you will get an extralong lunch hour and go to lunch before the rest of the school.

What will Dumfries Academy expect from me?

And show respect around the school by:

- · Following all instructions straight away.
- · Wearing the school uniform.
- · Talking and acting politely at all times.
- Walking directly and safely to your next class.
- · Eating and drinking only when you are allowed.

We focus on rewarding you when you have done well and we have a system of rewards to celebrate when you have excelled.





What support can I get?

Everyone has worries and problems from time to time, and we know that you will only be able to do your best when you feel happy and secure. It really helps to talk to someone, so we want you to come to us if you need help with anything in school or outside.

You can speak to any member of staff, but the best people to speak to are:

- Your tutor. You will see them every day and you will get to know each other well.
- The Principal Teacher of Pupil Support. There is one in each House.

We do not tolerate bullying of any sort, so if this is happening to you, tell a teacher straight away. We will sort it out.
