Dear Parent/Carer

This week has been another busy but productive week. I am delighted to share our parent-friendly version of our school improvement plan, which is included with this update. We are working through our priorities strategically and are currently evaluating our learners' experiences through learning walks and faculty reviews and we are also revising our approaches to learning in the BGE (S1-3) curriculum.

Our S1 pupils have made a good start. Our S2/3 pupils are settled and our senior phase pupils are working well in their chosen courses, as well as supporting younger pupils through various leadership roles in the school. There is a lot to be optimistic about.

On a slightly less positive note, our school was subjected to a significant amount of vandalism on Wednesday night. Five windows were broken and there was graffiti on our entrance door and area. This is devastating for our community, as we take such pride in our building. This is a police incident and I would ask that you and your children refrain from speculation on social media. I am thankful that pupils at Dumfries Academy are equally appalled by the damage to their school by vandals. This shows their own sense of pride and gratitude for the work that our team carries out to preserve our building.

School Uniform

I must compliment all pupils who adhere to our school uniform policy. In particular, I want to congratulate our new S1s who have embraced the policy and made a fantastic start in relation to school uniform standards. Well done to our pupils and families for showing that they are proud to wear our uniform and be identified as a Dumfries Academy pupil.



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S1 pupils have received a complimentary school tie. Our new S4 pupils are required to buy a senior tie from the school office. Ties are priced at £6.50. We would ask that all new S4 pupils are in possession of a senior tie.

We would be delighted if school leavers wish to donate uniform items such as school ties and blazers, as we can them recycle them and reduce costs for parents/carers. Please hand in any pre-loved items to our school office.

A reminder that school uniform should be worn at all times in school. Pupils should wear a shirt, blazer, tie, appropriate school trousers, skirt or black jeans and black shoes or trainers.

Leggings, football/gym/cycling shorts and jogging bottoms are not part of school uniform. School-style shorts may be worn in warm weather. Please bear these guidelines in mind when buying new uniform for your child.

Pupils enjoy school, reflect on their progress and are better prepared for life, learning and work


PRIORITY TWO
