This week has been one of the busiest this term: Manchester City Trip, Flu immunisation programme, P7 Catch-Up Evening, school photographer, S1-3 Wellbeing Interviews. The latter interviews were conducted by Mr Leonard, Miss Barton and Mr Dillon. They really enjoyed speaking to almost all pupils in S1-S3 to seek their views on how they felt about school. Once all pupils' views have been gathered, we will share our findings with our community. It was pleasing to hear that almost all young people interviewed feel safe, have a trusted adult they can speak to and are enjoying school.

Compassion: Our pupils have told us that our staff are compassionate and supportive in the lead up to prelims by taking account of their individual anxieties and circumstances

Fairness: We had a P7 catch up evening for those who missed the last one and this allowed 25 families to have a fair chance to see the school and ask questions

Respect: We held S1-3 wellbeing interviews this week to gather people's views and respect their opinion

Ambition: Our National 5 pupils are working hard to study for prelims next week as they care about their learning, are ambitious and want to achieve.

Responsibility: Our S6 pupils took responsibility for P7 Evening and ongoing responsibility for breakfast bar every morning

Parent Council

Our Parent Council and Loreburn Parent Council are meeting with representatives from the school estates tem on 4 December at 6 PM in G4. We hope that the team will be able to answer questions about our plans and timelines for school refurbishment. Any parent is most welcome to come along and find out more. The school is being refurbished and funds have been committed to this project. Your views and questions would be most appreciated.

Mobile Device Policy

As of Monday 3 December, we are relaunching our mobile device policy. Assemblies have been delivered to all year groups with the exception of S4 (due to S3 exams and prelims next week) regarding changes to our policy. We aim to share with S4 pupils next week. The revised policy was shared with our Parent Council earlier this month. Please note that we will initially run the policy as a pilot for the remainder of this term and revisit in January 2025.

33 students across S1-3 were sampled earlier this week to record their screen time (on mobile devices) from 18-25 November. The highest daily average screen time for an individual student was 10 hours and 43 minutes. The lowest was 2 hours and 40 minutes. S3 students had the highest daily screen time of 7 hours and 47 minutes. S2 had an average daily screen time of 5 hours and 56 minutes. S1 had an average daily screen time of 6 hours and 39 minutes.
