Dear Parent/Carer

Welcome back. I hope you and your child(ren) had a very pleasant October Break.

Although just back, we have had a very productive week. Seven S2 pupils took part in a 3 day residential trip at Barcaple Outdoor Centre; S3 pupils took part in a STEM trip to the National Museum of Scotland; we had an S1 Family Learning Event to showcase the S1 experience and highlight how families can support their child; many of our junior pupils donned some spooky costumes for our Hallowe'en Disco (Thank you to our S6 Events Committee and our Parent Council Chair, Liza Vinnie, for organising) and our N5/Higher Music pupils are attending Music Concert at the bridge today.

Staffing

We currently have 2 vacancies for full time teachers in Craft Design and Technology and Modern Languages. Despite attempts to recruit, we have not managed to secure teachers in these subject and this is in line with national trends and shortages in certain subjects. In the meantime, we are pleased to have managed to secure very strong supply teachers. We have also modified our timetable for some junior classes to ensure a consistent experience, based on developing key skills, whilst we seek to address the recruitment challenges we face.



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School Uniform

The standard of school uniform is satisfactory **but could be better**. We are one of very few schools that has provided ties free of charge to ensure that every pupil has a tie at the start of S1. I would ask for your support in ensuring that your child wears a school shirt, tie, appropriate skirt/trousers and black footwear to school every day. School blazers should also be worn and are particularly needed as an extra layer under an outdoor jacket as we see the colder weather creeping in.
