

How do I register my interest?



Lead teacher and practitioners can register interest in specific DYW Live courses at e-sgoil.com

Glow access is required to register for DYW Live.

Lead teachers will be automatically added to MS Teams on Glow for each course they have registered interest in. These teams will be managed by partners delivering live sessions.

Partners will communicate with lead teachers/practitioners via these MS Teams. Partners will confirm participation and will notify participating education staff of any requirements or updates to live sessions.

What happens during a DYW Live session?


Most DYW Live sessions will adopt this process:



Two partners per session; one delivering the live session, the other managing the chat function.

Live session streamed to Lead teacher/practitioners via MS Teams on Glow.

Lead teacher to communicate with partners via MS Teams chat function



Lead teachers/practitioners will broadcast live feed to learners within their own centre and communicate with the delivering partners via the MS Teams chat function. Learners can provide responses for lead teachers/practitioners to enter into chat.
