

Background

Forth Valley Alcohol & Drug Partnerships (ADPs) have adopted a tiered approach to understanding and responding to substance related problems in Forth Valley. We include all illegal drugs; alcohol; tobacco; solvents & gases, over-the-counter medicines and those prescribed that are commonly not used as directed.

Our definition of services and initiatives includes education and prevention work, support services, family support services, treatment and recovery services, mutual aid/self help support, rehabilitation and peer support services.

Each service / initiative has clarified its eligibility criteria and pathways of referral.

Consideration is given to workforce development requirements and the specific experience required for staff in order to support recovery.

Interventions Used

There are a limited number of interventions deemed effective within the substance field. The guiding principles in deciding what interventions should be made available to which clients and by what services should be based on a combination of:

- Evidence based practice
- Client need
- Service capacity
- Skills competencies and experience of staff

Eligibility Criteria

Clear eligibility criteria not only make it easier for staff and potential clients to access the service, it aids staff employed within any service to understand where their contribution "fits". By detailing the eligibility criteria for all services, an analysis of barriers to access and gaps in provision can be identified. A robust needs assessment is in place and can be found at www.forthvalleyadp.org.uk

Referral Process

A single point of referral is in operation across Forth Valley.

Once an individual enters the Forth Valley pathway and an initial assessment is completed there should be no additional barriers to the individuals speedy referral to the most appropriate provider.

Training & Qualifications of Staff

The ability of staff to deliver interventions and monitor outcomes is critical to the success of any service. Linked to this is the provision of appropriate and frequent clinical and managerial supervision.

Forth Valley ADPs recognise and prioritise workforce development for staff working in this field. The FV ADPs are committed to developing and implementing a comprehensive Workforce Development Plan in line with the Strategic Workforce Statement from the Scottish Government. This will enable Forth Valley to deliver to the highest standards and develop a suitably trained, confident, competent Alcohol and Drug Workforce to support the delivery of the Health and Social Care Standards - National Quality Principles for Substance Use Services.

Monitoring & Evaluation Processes

All services provide monthly outcomes and activity reports. For those services commissioned by ADPs quarterly reports form part of the Service Contract. All services will contribute information to the national data base DAISy (Drug and Alcohol Information System).

Social Inclusion Project (North and South Teams)

The social inclusion project provides holistic support to individuals affected by substance use and a wide range of social issues. The SIP takes a multidisciplinary approach working closely with agencies including Police Scotland, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, Local Authority Housing teams/Social Work and other partners across the third sector.

The aim of the SIP is to take a whole person approach to support, assisting individuals to engage with appropriate substance use services and to reduce instances of anti-social behaviour. The SIP supports service users to address housing and financial issues as well as encouraging engagement with services to address their physical/mental health. The SIP works closely with service users to encourage and promote confidence and trust in universal services and independence in their own lives.

Tackling Inequalities, Poverty and Improving Outcomes Project (Falkirk) The Tackling. Poverty Inequalities and Improving Outcomes Project aims to reduce health inequalities and improve the health and wellbeing of people in the justice system by identifying and addressing the health-related factors that impede their access to, and ability to engage in, volunteering, training, further learning and employment. Many people in contact with our justice services have multiple barriers to accessing and participating in employment. The barriers include poor physical health, mental health issues, substance use and poor access to health services appropriate to their needs. Almost every health problem, social issue and economic disadvantage is over-represented in the people who make up the justice cohort. Housing First Project (Falkirk)

Housing First is designed for people who need significant levels of help to enable them to leave homelessness.
