

- Understand your contribution to multi-agency risk assessment of risk and need, utilising the National Practice Model and Falkirk's Child's Plan paperwork
- Understand your statutory powers, duties and legal issues including good practice requirements that underpin Child Protection processes
- Understand the components that make up an effective child protection action plan, including being able to identify desired outcomes and how these will be measured
- Being able to ensure the views of the child or young person and family are appropriately represented in all aspects of child protection practice



We will review how they give a summary timeline of child and family circumstances [or those of an individual using adult services], patterns of behaviour and trends in lifestyle that may greatly assist any assessment and analysis.

The learning session will assist you in your practice with current and ongoing assessment and risk management, with particular emphasis on how you undertake ongoing analysis of the information you are recording.



Enhanced training for: Managers and practitioners who have a key role in the assessment of need for any child or family affected by Child Sexual Abuse. This learning resource is directed towards understanding this complex aspect of some children and young people's lives and the need for awareness towards preventative multiagency practice.

You would benefit from attending this training if your job role requires you to produce assessment/analytical reports on a child's behalf for formal statutory decision-making AND/OR that you contribute to the implementation of a multi-agency Child's Plans and decision making relevant to a child's safety and welfare

You would also benefit if your role has a specific, designated role in formal protection processes, including carrying out a child protection investigation and specific, focused or specialist risk assessments

Content: This complex area of practice is intended to offer insight on what we mean by child sexual abuse, including Child Sexual Exploitation, the immediate and long-term potential impact of child sexual abuse on children through their life, impact on a family when this is disclosed or discovered; supporting a child or young person and their family where child sexual abuse has been identified and how this relates to child protection, including assessment and intervention.
