Content: This learning session will confirm our understanding of chronologies knowing that they provide a key link in the chain of understanding needs/risks, including the need for protection from harm. We will review how they give a summary timeline of child and family circumstances [or those of an individual using adult services], patterns of behaviour and trends in lifestyle that may greatly assist any assessment and analysis.

The learning session will assist you in your practice with current and ongoing assessment and risk management, with particular emphasis on how you undertake ongoing analysis of the information you are recording.

Let’s Talk About Stigma (Substance Use)

Learning & Development Framework:

Multi-Agency | In-person | Skilled Practice | Learning Session

Skilled training for: Falkirk Council and partner agency staff across services where stigma may impact engagement, outcomes, or staff confidence—including housing, social work, health, criminal justice, education, and community support teams.

Content : Facilitated by Alcohol and Drug DP Development Officer, this training is designed to challenge and reduce stigma around substance use, mental health, and social disadvantage—particularly within frontline service delivery. It equips staff with the awareness, tools, and confidence to respond with compassion, fairness, and professionalism in every interaction.

- Core Learning Objectives:** By the end of the session, participants will:
- Understand what stigma is, how it works, where it comes from, and how it shows up in policy, language, and everyday interactions
 - Explore the impact of stigma on individuals, communities, and service engagement
 - Reflect on **unconscious bias** and common stigmatising language.
 - Recognise that stigma is often unintentional but still harmful, and identify ways to interrupt it
 - Learn how to use non-stigmatising, inclusive language and reframe narratives around people who use drugs, live in poverty, or face mental health challenges

The child and adolescent Neglect Toolkit is a structured judgement tool designed to assist professionals to identify whether children and adolescents are at risk of, or experiencing, parental neglect (parent is used throughout to refer to any main caregiver) and to plan action to address this in collaboration with parents.

It is a tool to be used supervision, multi-agency meetings, core groups, team around the child meetings, child protection planning meetings and in partnership with families, to help professionals to reflect on the child/young person's circumstances, and help to put concerns into context, identifying strengths and resources.

The toolkit can be used to inform decision-making, assessments and planning.

It does not replace other professional assessments processes but is a complementary framework.

- Exploring and defining neglect
- How to identify neglect using the Neglect Toolkit
- Highlighting the importance of assessment and analysis in recordings
- Using the Neglect Toolkit resources
- Increase skills and confidence in being able to share concerns, undertake assessments and make plans alongside families.
