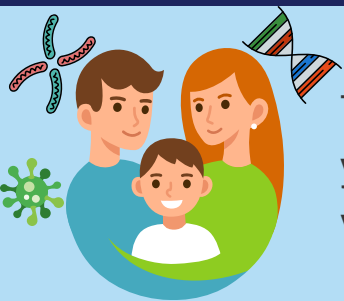
## I'm worried about...
