Head lice



Within schools and early years centres head lice can be easily spread during head to head contact with young children. Head lice can't be prevented however regular checking ensures early detection and treatment. There are different treatments, which can be used and are available from the pharmacist. The best detection method is wet combing. Please see below for some information

Tips /facts about head lice

- Head louse eggs take up to 10 days to hatch
- Treatment is only needed when a thorough check detects live lice.
- Baby lice take 6-14 days to become fully-grown it is after this that they will take the opportunity to move head to head during close contact.
- Insecticide lotions should not be used preventatively (this makes lice become resistant)
- Head lice can't jump, fly or swim they pass through head to head contact moving swiftly along the hair.

ChildSmile

We have recently had a visit from ChildSmile where the dental nurses shared toothbrushing techniques with the children. The NHS recommend all children are registered with a dentist and attend regular check-ups. If your child is not registered with a dentist please speak to your

Health Visitor as this is something they can support with.
