

We have had a number of concerns regarding double parking within the car park, cars stopping abruptly to let children out of the car and of cars parked on the road outside of the school, blocking traffic.

Our disabled bays should **only** be used by Blue Badge Holders or designated taxis.

From the 21<sup>st</sup> to the 25<sup>th</sup> March, we will be taking part in Scottish Rugby Schools Week. Primary 4 pupils will be having Rugby Taster Sessions and everyone across the school will be taking part in Rugby themed activities.



## House System

A few months ago, we relaunched our updated House System here in school; something we have always had. Our houses used to be named after planets, but following much discussion from our pupils, the decision was made to vote on new House names and change the way we collect points.

In a landslide victory, the winner was Elements, so we now have Earth, Air, Fire and Water as our school Houses.

Every child in the school is in a House and can earn points for their House by displaying the school values, working hard, being kind and helpful and lots more!

Every week, our House Captains and Vice Captains visit classes to collect any completed House Point sheets and certificates are awarded to children.

25 points will earn a Bronze Certificate, 50 points will earn a Silver Certificate, 100 points will earn a Gold Certificate and 200 points will earn a special prize.

If we have a focus week, we will post on the school blog and share what the focus will be. For example, this week we will be focusing on being inclusive.



## Sporting Events

We are delighted that some of our pupils have been able and will be continuing to take part in SLC wide sporting events. This week some of our P6s and P7s represented the school in Cross Country Running with one of our pupils returning with a Bronze medal – well done Alana! Charlotte and Jess from P6 and Holly and Alana in P7 will now go on to represent the school in the SLC Final.

We have also had Primary 5 – 7 pupils out at football games – both our girls and boys football teams. They will be going out again next week.

**Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel** is the UK's largest inter-school walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge that inspires pupils to be amazing and take active journeys to school.

**The 2022 challenge**

See your local area from a new perspective, learn about the benefits of active travel and discover amazing journeys to school from around the world.

**How it works**

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils walking, using a wheelchair, scooting or cycling to school.

A school's best five days will determine their final position and schools at the top of their leaderboards will receive an exclusive Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel certificate.

Our vision is a society where the way we travel creates healthier places and happier lives for everyone.

**Prizes**

All schools will be entered into daily prize draws for rewards if over 15% of your school takes part on each day of the challenge. Prizes up for grabs include accessories and equipment to help your school travel actively.


