Traffic Survey

We have recently taken part in a survey of traffic in and around the school which was carried out by SLC. Their staff observed the use of the car park and the surrounding area. We have had several complaints from residents who live across from the school due to people blocking their driveways and also creating a dangerous area by parking on the road itself. We have been asked by SLC to contact the police to monitor this situation. As always we ask parents to park safely in the school itself, not to double park, park in bus zones, disabled bays without a Blue Badge or in drop off areas or on the grass as this creates a hazard for pedestrians and other drivers. Our Junior Road Safety officers led the recent WOW walk to school event which was very successful. They will also share road safety advice with pupils and families throughout the school year. We continue to ask for a crossing patrol to be put in place to aid pedestrians crossing the road at the main gate and have highlighted to SLC that parents have concerns about this too. We will keep you updated on any progress on this issue.
