## Interdisciplinary Learning

We are going to be busy this term in our topic work. We are starting the year with a Science theme ~ Day and Night. We will be learning about the rotations of the moon and earth in relation to the sun. Over the next couple of weeks keep looking out for the moon and tell me what you notice.

## Health and Wellbeing

The children will continue to focus on the SHANARRI indicators throughout the year and we will also be looking at and discussing the articles related to our class charter.

## P.E

Our PE sessions are on a **MONDAY (indoors)** and **THURSDAY (outdoors)**. Suitable outdoor clothes (tracksuit/jogging trousers/hoodie) and suitable footwear are needed for this session. A waterproof jacket might also be necessary. Please note, on PE days the children are permitted to come to school wearing these clothes as they will not be changing in school.

Please remember that all jewellery must be removed on PE days. Pupils who have recently had their ears pierced will be expected to cover their ears with tape.

Water Bottles ~ Pupils are encouraged to drink **plain water** throughout the day in class. We would be grateful if you could supply a named water bottle for this purpose every day.

In our Literacy and Language programme we will be working hard to learn our spelling words. **Please encourage your child to practise; it's very important at this stage.**

We will be learning new phonemes and trying to use different strategies to help us to remember how to spell tricky words. We will soon be enjoying a variety of reading books at our level. Please listen to and discuss these with your child, as they will be eager to share their new reading material with you!

Our writing genres for this term will be Narrative and Instructions.

## Numeracy

We will be working on many areas in maths over the coming year. This term we will focus on numbers to 100, addition, number through Number Talks, Data Handling and Shape and Pattern.
