1 day per fortnight	20 days per year	4 weeks per year	nearly 1 ½ years
1 day per week	40 days per year	8 weeks per year	over 2 ½ years
2 days per week	80 days per year	16 weeks per year	over 5 years
3 days per week	120 days per year	24 weeks per year	nearly 8 years

1 hour per day	1 day per week	8 weeks per year	over 2 ½ years

<p><b>Very Good</b> Best chance to succeed. Gets your child off to a flying start.</p>		<p><b>Cause for Concern</b> Less chance of success. Makes it harder for your child to progress. Chance of involvement from Educational Welfare Team.</p>		<p><b>Serious Concern</b> Your child will find it very difficult to make progress. May result in court action and involvement from other agencies.</p>	
<p><b>90% is the threshold set by the government for Persistent Absence</b></p>
