The way Rosshall Academy pupils present themselves and the way that they are perceived is highly important. Our uniform projects an ethos of purpose, pride, professional identity and equality amongst the pupil population as well as enhancing the reputation of the school. It is also important that pupils wear visible uniform for security reasons as this would enable us to spot an intruder very quickly.

This session the majority of our learners were in full school uniform: they look extremely smart and are a credit to you. However, we need the support of all parents and carers as a minority of young people still attend school without recognisable uniform.

I ask for your support in ensuring that your child is in full school uniform from August 2018 and throughout the school year.

Uniform expectations for all learners



Black blazer with school badge



White school shirt



School tie



Black cardigan / jumper / sweatshirt (with school tie visible)

**Please note plain black hooded tops (without logos other than Rosshall Logo) may be worn, provided the school tie is visible*



Black school trousers / skirt



Black shoes or black trainers

The following items must not be worn:

- × Denims, tracksuit trousers / joggers / leggings / shorts
- × Logos other than Rosshall logo
- × Brightly coloured / football / hooded tops*
- × Shoes of any colour other than black

Should your child arrive in school without appropriate uniform, the Pastoral Care Teacher or House Head will be in contact with you to address this immediately.

There are many ways in which we can support families to meet our uniform expectations: please speak to your son /daughter's Pastoral Care teacher if you would like to discuss further. Information and application forms for a clothing grant for young people of all ages, including 16+, are available from the school office. We can also assist with completing grant applications. Last summer many of you handed in blazers and other items of uniform (see above), which were in good condition, for recycling. This was much appreciated by many of our families and I would ask that you continue to do this during the summer of 2018, knowing that the items you donate will be used by other young people.
