## Welcome to the University of Glasgow S5 University Experience Week!

Please read on for important information to help you get the best out of the experience. We also want to check that we have all the necessary information to support you.

University Week runs from Monday 12th – Friday 16th June 2023. You are expected to attend for the full week. Registers will be taken and attendance records will be passed on to your school.

You will be on campus from 9.30am-5.00pm on Monday 12th, Tuesday 13th, and Thursday 15th June. On Thursday 15th June, you will register with us and then attend the Open Day.

On Wednesday 13th and Friday 16th June you will participate online. Your school will tell you whether you are expected to do this from home, or at school.

If there is any reason you can't attend any part of the week or you are unwell, please get in touch. We will also need your school to contact us and confirm this.

## **Getting to Campus**

- Plan your journey to make sure you arrive on time.
- University of Glasgow can be reached by bus, train and subway and is on many main public transport routes. There is space to lock bicycles by the Library, as well as many other spots on campus.
- Under 22s can participate in the Young Persons' Free Bus Travel Scheme. Visit <a href="https://getyournec.scot/nec">https://getyournec.scot/nec</a> for information and to apply for your card if you don't already have one.
- If you are running late and miss registration, please go directly to your class as noted on your timetable and check in with your tutor. If you are not sure what to do, email the summer school team and we will direct you.

### Where do I go?

Each morning on campus, you should arrive by 9.30am at the Boyd Orr Building. The Boyd Orr is accessible from University Avenue or University Garden. These are the lecture theatres you should go to on the following days:

- Monday 12th June Boyd Orr: 222. Lecture Theatre 2. This is on the ground floor.
- Tuesday 13th June Lecture Theatre 407A (accessible by the stairs and lifts).
- Thursday 15th June Lecture Theatre 409 (on the same floor as 407).

## Clothing

- Glasgow University campus is quite large, so you may want to consider comfortable footwear and a waterproof jacket for moving around.

# **Online Days**

During online learning days, you must be online in time to join your first online meetings. We will provide your log in details on Monday 12th June. Please remember to keep these log in details private as they are personal to you. **Do not** try to log in before this induction session. The system may lock you out and it can take time to resolve. Check your timetable for the links to join these Teams meetings.

For online days, make sure that you have a suitable device (a PC, Laptop, or your GCC iPad) to participate in the sessions. \*Please note that phones are not appropriate devices for these activities\*

Remember that online attendance is just as important as physical attendance on campus. You should participate fully in online classes by keeping your camera on, where possible, and taking part in the chats or via microphone where this is appropriate. Check that you have an appropriate background and learning space.

#### Anything else?

Throughout the University Experience Week, you will also complete our online Academic Skills Module.

Over the course of the week, you will be treated as a University of Glasgow student and there will be the same expectations of appropriate and respectful conduct.
