Quality Improvement Workstream Event Hosted by Fife Council

An opportunity for a targeted group of Primary Schools across the SEIC to engage in an inspection focused event. It will provide an up-to-date strategic overview from Education Scotland with a focus on the latest legislation and inspection landscape and across the South East Improvement Collaborative. Recently inspected schools will provide practical workshops sharing their experiences and specific areas highlighted as part of their inspection findings.

Subject Leaders Network Event Hosted across all Local Authorities

The Subject Leaders Network events will focus on working collaboratively with lead practitioners for each subject in the secondary networks and pull together the findings from all 5 local authorities to create a range of bespoke professional learning for each subject area. Using collaborative knowledge and understanding of our system, participants will plan CLPL events and begin planned work to support improvements in Learning and Teaching within each subject area. Additionally, this will develop leadership skills and capacity for those involved.

Frequently Asked Questions

What should I do now?

Share event opportunities with staff to sign up – There will be limited spaces at sign up events to allow as many schools to access as possible. Please check each sign-up event individually. Sign-ups will open Wednesday 4th September at 9am, and close on Monday 23rd September at 5:30pm.

What if there are no events which meet the needs of my school?

The e-Collaboration Pack and Videos should help develop capacity for collaboration.

Is there anything else I can be involved in?

Yes! A number of networks are currently finalising their offer for practitioners – please watch the website for updates on additional events. Schools may also wish to make their own arrangements for peer visits to other schools or to take part in collaborative cluster working. These could include cross-authority visits where schools have identified partners with a similar context (e.g. through the BGE toolkit/Insight)
