More on SEICThe South East Improvement Collaborative work is based on robust analysis of data, leading to two areas of focus: improving attainment and achievement including closing the attainment gap, and quality improvement within education settings.

<u>Did you know that</u>.....the proportion of school leavers entering a positive destination from school across the South East Collaborative region as a whole, is close to the national average (92.7% for SEIC vs 93.2% for Scotland)? Collective efforts within each authority and across the SEIC will help young people due to leave school this year, have a positive and sustainable next step in place. Watch this space for some exciting new SEIC work happening in this area.
