Mary Louise was hoping to have a Community Litter Pick to promote the Parent Council and the work they do. This can also tie in with Climate Change. She has contacted Darnley Primary Parent Council about this and they are interested too. Just looking for a suitable day/date/time. It was agreed to look at a Saturday or Sunday morning or after school on a Wednesday/Thursday. It was agreed to try for Sunday 19th September and see who can make it. If the turnout is not great another date can be arranged. Olu asked how we get equipment for this – The equipment is in the Sunshine Room and Mrs LaCombre has given her permission for it to be used. (litter pickers). It was agreed to

purchase bin bags which will be left at the school bins once full. Mary Louise will chat to Darnley Primary PC as to what areas should be covered.

Memorial Garden

Aiming for a sustainability Award this time next year if agreed with the group. Lots of the work has already been done for this but we don't talk about it much. An Action Plan needs to be put in place anr the word sustainability needs to be used continuously to tick all the boxes.

A celebration at the end of the year would be great to show the work that has already been done on the grounds. A date in June to be set for this, possibly a Saturday morning for 3-4 hours. There could be a fire pit, smores, outdoor activities and everyone getting together to celebrate. Mrs LaCombre is reluctant to set a date at the moment as SPAC is looking to return on a Saturday morning and the Sacramental dates have not been confirmed yet. A potential date of Tuesday 7th June was suggested but may need to change. If the event was in the evening access to the toilets etc would be needed and a Let would have to be booked. A time would also need to be decided.

Memorial Garden will now have more lives to be remembered. Fundraising had started but has stalled slightly.

The memorial plaque for Mr McGoughan is here but another plaque for family members lost recently can be bought. It was agreed to ask the family how they felt about this and abide by their wishes. Mrs LaCombre will speak to the family.

Road Safety

Mary Louise said that they have been quite active over the past few weeks as the schools have now returned. They are working in partnership with Darnley Primary who are working with Glasgow City Council. They will get together soon on a Thursday evening for a brief rundown.

Emma – monitoring Greenacres Drive to see what the problems are as we want to be seen to be supporting the local residents. There have been at least 4 incidents there recently. Parking cones have been put out to deter parking by parents. The Highway code states that you can't park on a dropped kerb because wheelchairs, prams etc need to be able to use them. It has been challenging trying to get that across to some drivers. Emma challenged a blue badge holder today who thought they could park anywhere. She says it's hard but she is always polite and points out potential hazards to pedestrians and residents. More advice is needed from Police Scotland as to putting out cones etc. It was suggested communicating with the first 20 residents in the street to get them on board. Videos and photos of car registrations have been taken. There was a recent incident involving an emergency vehicle finding it difficult to get through. The residents are aware of these issues. It was suggested that we ask the pupils to challenge their parents if they are not parking properly and encourage them to use Sainsburys car park. This has been done but to no avail.

It takes a team of people to put out/take in the cones. It is not illegal to do this as it's not a motoring symbol. More clarity needed on how active we can be. If purchasing Parking Buddies a team would be needed too and they would have to be taken out in all weather. Glen Orchy is getting busy again too so the committee are trying to find what they can do legally to keep everyone safe there also. Getting the residents on board is very important. It is good to have PC Mark as a contact and to have a meeting with. Olu has been out doing this since Monday and has asked others to join them when they can. He has also contacted Anna Richardson to see if she can come in. He will email her again.

Memorial

This has been spoken about earlier. Mary Louise said this was started last year but, due to the tragedy over the summer, will need to be approached again with sensitivity. Need to action withdrawal of funds from GoFundMe in to a personal account then on to the school account. She is making everyone aware of this for transparency.

Eabhnat asked if we could withdraw that money and start another GoFundMe fundraiser as it says in the blurb this was for last year and would be continuing.

Fiona asked about options for PayPal money pools and have the benches arrived yet? Benches not arrived as school was closed over the summer. Fiona will follow this up as the bench should arrive with the plaque on it. Mrs LaCombre said that the plaque was already here. Fiona will get on to this.
