Head Teachers Report

Industrial Action

On 28th Feb and 1st March. EIS, Nasuwt and AHDS. Expected school closure

Residential for P7 next year

Booked for 27th Nov – 1st Dec at Ardentinny. Cost is £277 per child without transport. School will subsidise and pay for buses (£1632). Cost per child will be capped at £250 and funding will be found to cover the extra costs. The school would like to put this information out as soon as possible to allow families to spread the cost. We are booked late Nov/early Dec as the costs are significantly cheaper.

Walking Bus

The Eco Committee are provisionally introducing a walking bus on 20th, 21st, 22nd March and 27th, 28th, 29th March. 8:20 in morning from skate park along the path to MUGA. Forms will be sent out to gauge numbers. This is the safer pathway to the school.

Saltire

Fruitful meeting last week, work underway with steering group and staff to engage further with outdoor learning and family engagement priorities.

iPads

iPads are due to be rolled out soon to every pupil. There are some issues with software updates on the current P5-P6 iPads.

Thomas – If a child has their own iPad at home will they still get one?

Mr Kerlin – Yes, as these iPads have all the necessary apps for school. This means P1-P4 will have more access to the shared iPads until there is a full rollout.

Bullying Workshops – Policy

Mrs Isaac and I went to an Anti-Bullying workshop yesterday. Pupils were there also so that their voices could be heard. PC and parental views are also needed. Date to be confirmed to have information session on bullying and the new policy and procedures on dealing with it

Project Priorities:

With pupils:

- Bark in Sensory Garden, Willow, path to Faerie Ring, Mud Kitchen
- Maintenance, weeding & replanting (where needed) of existing beds
- Wildflower Meadow & Wildlife Garden
- Wooden signs in all areas
- Paint furniture in mud kitchen & bus
- Sunshine Room clear out, lights & stock

Adults:

• Prune top of Willow

- Apply for sapling trees to replace trees mowed over by grounds maintenance
- Power wash & repair / replace furniture in mud kitchen & bus
- Loose parts play, den building & mud kitchen equipment. Get another donation drive going for this.

Continuity:

Wei Ling, Tahira & Eabhnat are P7 parents/carers and if unsuccessful in our Wellbeing Fund application, will be stepping back from the project in June. Need to involve more adult volunteers and create a continuity plan.

Action

P7 Sub Committee

Mr Kerlin – Sample hoodies are here. Happy for the pupils to choose their own sizes but don't know how the parents will feel about that.

Mrs Isaac – We can give a form home with the size and they can order online.

Mr Kerlin – Do we need parental say for what goes on them?

Eabhnat – Yes, we do.

Mr Kerlin – We'll send a form home so parents can approve the name.

Lucy – Can they not just have their initials?

All – Better with the name on the back and something on the sleeve.

Lucy – Parents can choose.

Mrs Isaac – We only had names on back last year due to costs.

Lucy – Maybe just keep it that way.

Eabhnat – Luciana will be in next Friday to speak to the P7's. Spring Fling disco all in hand.

Mr Kerlin – I'll speak to Luciana tomorrow and we can get moving on this.

Action

PC Housekeeping

Staff Reps Mr Kerlin and Mrs Isaac. We can also have a co-opted 3rd member.

Mr Kerlin – Mrs Isaac also represents the nursery. Reps are Mr Kerlin, Mrs Isaac, Lisa and Amanda.

Eabhnat – I nominate Lisa as a co-opted member.

Jacqueline – I second that nomination.

Bus Pass

Mrs LaCombre thought that the free bus passes could be used for class trips etc. The problem may be that there is not enough room on the bus for all pupils. Can the PC also be available to help support parents to get the bus passes. More for ASL families and those with connectivity issues. Can anyone help with this?

Mrs Isaac – We could put the link on SeeSaw.

Fiona – Post it up and we can find out how many need help.

Jacqueline – Good idea.

Eabhnat – Hope to get everyone sorted for the summer so they can be used over the holidays and for starting High School.

Mr Kerlin – Fiona can you send me the link.

Eabhnat – Are we happy to signpost to the PC?

Fiona – Photo ID is needed and I needed to get my own verification to process things. Seems to be easier now.

Eabhnat – Paul are you interested?

Paul – I can only do a Friday afternoon if that's okay.

Mr Kerlin – We will know from the link how many need help.

Fiona – Can we use the computer suite?

Mr Kerlin – The computer suite is not the same as before as the PC's are no longer working as we are using iPads. Can't download apps on to the iPads as they belong to GCC.

Eabhnat – Can they do it on a personal device?

Mr Kerlin – Yes.

Fiona – We can use a Friday afternoon to help those who are unsure.

Jacqueline – We could have a step-by-step guide.

Mr Kerlin – Could do something on Parent's night if there is a need.

Lucy – I used the Parent Portal and it was really easy.

Mr Kerlin – Yes, if you are signed up for that it is much easier.

Mrs Isaac – Some people think that's the same as ParentPay.

Eabhnat – Okay, send out the link etc.

PC Presence

Parent's night and P1 enrolment. Do we have enough people to run a stall, give out flyers etc and get us noticed?

Fiona – Can we make the stall more informative i.e., local clubs, free events during summer holidays etc.

Eabhnat – Sounds good. Who can do this?

Fiona – I can try my best.

Lucy – I can help if we are doing tea/coffee etc. Is there room?

Mr Kerlin – The ICT suite might be available, or the library space.

Eabhnat – Can we put this on. Is anyone available?

Mr Kerlin – We also have a recruitment and training session on 20th February at 6p.m. on Zoom if anyone is interested.

Eabhnat – I'll put it on the chat and make a plan re tea/coffee. Will put on agenda.

Action

GCPG Letter

Letter emailed out. Very concerned about the proposed cuts and how these will affect the most vulnerable in the city. The letter template has been put together for all to sign and send on. This can be done collectively or individually.

Any thoughts on what we can add in that's specific to St Angela's?

Jacqueline – Have they taken away free lunches altogether?

Eabhnat – Not sure. I thought it was just the holiday programme. I'm happy to print this letter and sign on behalf of the PC. We can also send our own.

Mr Kerlin – We are massively concerned that talk of ESL being cut, dyslexia service stopping, swimming lessons for P6 being cut etc.

Eabhnat – These are so important to the children, especially the swimming lessons as these are life lessons.

Jacqueline – GCC offer a 5 block of lessons for £25 during the summer and we have used this.

Mrs Isaac – Swimming is free during the summer also.

Mr Kerlin – St Angela's are extremely underfunded by PEF. We are at a lower level to other local primary schools. We have no buffer in terms of PEF and, if our core budget is affected, this will impact everything – staffing, what's available etc.

Eabhnat – I've seen it from working in other schools.

Fiona – We are already disadvantaged as we can't bring in a lot of the services the other local schools have.

Action

Road Safety

Have discussed this continually. What can we actually do and can anyone step forward to help.

Thomas – Down south they take photos of the driver and fine them. Is the school still a car free zone? Things will only change if fines are issued.

Mr Kerlin – Spoke to police about that this morning and they wanted to give out warnings instead., but this doesn't work. The problem has now moved to Greenacres.

Jacqueline – Why can't they just park at Sainsburys.

Mr Kerlin – Our staff are being verbally abused as they are trying to keep the children safe. Action is needed. The Road Safety group in the school are keen to go

but it's not children who drive cars! We also have to maintain good relationships with the parents/carers.

Lucy – What about those parents who just stop in the middle of the road and let their children out.

Jacqueline – A car parks on the pavement at the Main Road to let their child out.

Mr Kerlin – They know it's wrong and someone is going to get seriously hurt.

Eabhnat – Emma and Tricia were on the road safety committee.

Mr Kerlin – I like the Parking buddies but not sure what impact they have. We don't want to put anyone in danger when taking them out and bringing them in.

Eabhnat – Another school has a "pedestrianised" street for 45 minutes. We could do that in the street if we chose to.

Paul – Can we ask for stickers for those who actually stay on that street and they can display them. No sticker, no entry.

Mr Kerlin – They should have them already.

Thomas – Why do they have to park so close to the school when they can use McDonalds or Sainsburys.

Fiona – Do people who regulate the Car Free Zones monitor this as I know of only one school where this is working. They only have 1 street in and out.

Mrs Isaac – They should have done both streets here as one leads to the other.

Mr Kerlin – Local problem-solving team (Hannah). I have asked to meet them at 9a.m. and 3p.m. as we need to talk about the bus stop at the school as that's also a hazard.

Mrs Isaac – That bus stop causes all sorts of issues.

Mr Kerlin – I want a team round the table to deal with this. There are people in the authority who put these things in place but don't monitor them and don't know what's involved. The children shouldn't have to deal with this as they are here to learn.

Eabhnat – We will email out about this too.

Thomas – Put it on SeeSaw that fines have been issued. This may stop some parents.

Agsa – If school can't do this then we can as a PC.

Mr Kerlin – Junior road safety officers are coming up with posters, flyers etc.

Eabhnat – We can't put flyers on cars now as it is classed as littering. Can the flyers etc say that parking is available at Sainsburys and McDonalds?

Lucy – Can the children put a video out on SeeSaw about this?

Mr Kerlin – Yes, I'll speak to the committee about this.

Eabhnat – Will put actions in place and update.

Action

Fundraising

Do we want to have a focussed fundraising page over and above our normal stuff? A few years ago we set up a target of £1000 for the Sunshine Room etc, and we realised that. Do we want to do this again? What would it be for? We need to be mindful of how we word it (cost of living etc). Doing it through Parent Pay takes the burden off parents if they can't/don't have the means to do this.

Lucy – Easter raffle might be good again.

Agsa – Can we have a children sponsored read?

Eabhnat – Sounds good but may put pressure on families to get sponsors.

Jacqueline – Pyjama Day?

Eabhnat – Again, if on ParentPay no one needs to know.

Mr Kerlin – The issues with ParentPay won't happen again.

Lucy – I'd like to pay for the whole year but it won't let me. Have to do it one at a time.

Eabhnat – Some parents in St Paul's had errors and were charged extra so niggles do happen. Lucy are you happy to organise again?

Lucy – Yes. We can do the draw on Wednesday 29th March so prizes can be picked up before the Easter holidays. How many prizes?

Jacqueline – Can get good things from B & M cheaply.

Lucy – How much will we spend? Can I contact local businesses etc?

Thomas – I'll donate £100 towards the prizes.

Eabhnat – That should cover all the costs. Thank you Thomas. What about the targeted fundraiser?

Thomas – How about the P7 trip?

Eabhnat – We already spend a lot on P7 so we want to include the whole school.

Lucy – What about SALTIRE? Do we know of anyone struggling financially that we could help?

Mr Kerlin – Sometimes we target specific groups. Parents will be invited in to the school and we would like the PC to help fund that with money for resources, tea/coffee etc. Every child will have a family learning day and it's good for getting to know each other. Would be nice to have something for the parents/carers. Could the PC help set up a hospitality fund that the school can dip in to.

Fiona – We can say the fund is for Parental engagement as it was part of the SIP.

Eabhnat – That would be very beneficial to all.

Mr Kerlin – We are told to get the families in to interact with their children and have fun.

Eabhnat – People may not want to come in for organised events but will feel more comfortable in a relaxed, informal environment.

Mr Kerlin – All these events start at 2p.m. so we can have everything set up for them.

Eabhnat – What is a realistic target then?

Mr Kerlin – We have 7 events so is £50 per event enough?

Lucy – Will we provide everything?

Eabhnat – Yes. Melanie can get it at a good price from Costco if we give enough notice.

Lucy – Target £500?

Mr Kerlin – That sounds good.

Eabhnat - £50 per event and a little extra for anything else.
