Head Teachers Report

HT newsletter sent out – informative. Would like to hear any feedback on whether there is too much information, not enough etc.

Nicky – It's good to have a list of events.

Mr Kerlin – Dates are important for all terms.

Staffing – 3 staff members retiring at the end of the year. Thanks to all of them for their service to the school.

The budget means we had a staffing level of 18.2 last season but this will be reduced to 17.3. This equates to the loss of a teacher. All classes will have a teacher but this will affect work that takes place during time out of class. PT's will now have to be timetabled to classes more. Education will be the same as always but other things will have to give. It will be challenging. We need to cover NCC time but this may have to be done differently next school year. We are looking at using assembly time but we can be creative around this. We may have to look at PEF but this will affect our SFL workers as we need teachers to be in class. Hoping to get 2 probationers to enable us to keep our SFL workers that we have at the moment. Mrs Thompson and Mrs Shaw will be your port of call as normal but they may need to go in to class next school year if we have absences.

On 13h May at 4.30p.m. SNP Councillors are coming to Darnley Primary school to speak and they have opened it up to our school to go along too.

Eabhnat – GCPG have also organised some protests and this has been shared on our WhatsApp chat. Is there any information about PT's being reduced in numbers?

Mr Kerlin – I don't think so based on our school role. Their job will be more difficult if they also have to be in class more.

Building Update - Since the email was sent from the PC there has been a flurry of activity around the school and all positive. PC have the power to change things.

Boiler and water tanks needing to be replaced – moving.

Covered walkway in P1 – been told this is safe but are looking at it. Services run through this also and someone has been out looking at this.

The fence at the back garden has been fixed.

Leak in corridor – Can't find where this is coming from but will keep looking.

Wee huts – The Director of Education commented on them and conversations have been taking place on refurbishment.

P1 Playground – Area Partnership work starting.

Family Engagement – These have been well attended. Thanks to Mrs Thompson for all her hard work.

SIP Priorities – These are set for 3 years, until 2026. Consultation will be put out to all parents to get your thoughts.

Culture Committee – I would like to thank everyone involved for all their help and support throughout the school year.

Eid Bazaar – This was a fabulous event with great food and a real sense of community. Thank you to everyone involved.

Homework Policy – This will go live from August.

Sacraments – P3 Sacrament of Reconciliation has taken place. Confirmation will be in St Vincents of Thursday 16th May and First Holy Communion will take place in St Roberts.

Rana Harris Memorial Garden – The Area Partnership Fund have given us £8000 + and this will allow us to improve the garden and send 2 pupils to Blairvadoch (as mentioned in last months minutes). We will invite his dad in and get his input on everything we are planning to do.

Summer Trip – This will take place on 6th June and will be £15 per family and £5 per child. The total cost will be over £3000. Will speak to PC and get your views.

Mr Kerlin - Crowdfunding Campaign - Eabhnat has been working really hard on this. I agreed to speak to some local businesses. Spoke to 17 and received nothing. They are all good taking the information but are having to refer it "higher up". They want to give hospitality gifts but we are looking for cash. This is proving difficult. We are trying to get others to put their hands in their pockets so it's not always just our parents/carers. Eabhnat – I haven't shared the link with parents yet because we were trying to target businesses. We will now share it out to the wider Parent Forum to see if any of their

businesses can help, or if they know anyone with their own business. We're not looking at individual families to pay.

Mr Kerlin – Macklin Motors have offered really good prizes – a car for a week, St Mirren Mascot, an air fryer etc. We can take these and use them for donations for a raffle.

Eabhnat – If we share the link next week and say that it is aimed at businesses then we can ask families if they would like to buy the raffle tickets. We can make them £5 per ticket if those are the prizes we would have.

Fiona – Have you spoken to the housebuilders?

Mr Kerlin – Not yet but I will do.

Fiona – Go to their onsite office.

Eabhnat – Let them know that we should be getting some press release coverage on this. That might help.

The SALTIRE Treasure hunt will be done a little differently this year. Card needs to be stamped before prizes given out.

Mary Louise will run the raffle. Volunteers will be needed.

It will cost £500 + VAT for the marshmallows and loose parts play. We will pay the school and they will get this through procurement so no VAT needs to be paid.

The SALTIRE group are looking for some funds from the PC to pay for compostable cups (£110 for 1000) and chocolate coins and stampers for the Treasure Hunt (£20 - £30).

Mr Kerlin – The school will pay for the cups as we have been using yours during the school day and this way, we can both share them.

Eabhnat – Cups can be stored in the Sunshine Room so long as they are dry.

Thomas – I think you might find the cups are cheaper on Amazon.

Mr Kerlin – Just let me know if the school has to write you a cheque or you want to send us a link and we can buy them.

Eabhnat – Good that means we can ask for £100 for good trowels, watering cans etc instead.

Mr Kerlin – What about asking if B&Q or Argos will donate them?

Eabhnat – Will do. PC will need to cover cost of printing raffle tickets.

Fiona – Re Rana's Garden. I've seen on Facebook children painting pebbles with peace, love etc and using these. Might be nice to do something like this.

Mr Kerlin – We have put Spider Arts in the application Fiona, we can have a chat about this. Fiona – Thank you.

Mr Kerlin – St Roberts are usually good at putting something on.

Lucy – Summer trip money, how much is needed from PC?

Mr Kerlin – SVDP have helped out and school will too. Maybe PC could buy more toys that we can use on the day and in the playground.

Lucy - How much will we spend?

Fiona – Is it worth asking Sainsburys and B& M to donate?

Eabhnat – Sounds good but who is going to do this.

Fiona – I don't mind asking some of them. Re money why don't we agree to give half for toys and half to the school in cash.

Mr Kerlin – I will let you know week beginning 27th May.

Thomas – How much do you need?

Mr Kerlin – We don't know as the payments are just starting to come in now.

Eabhnat – PC funds are available so may not need to use school funds.

Lucy – What if we give £500 and we can work out how to split it later.

Mr Kerlin – Last year we got ice creams when we came back as there was not enough time to do it on the day.

Thomas – Are children allowed to bring spending money?

Mr Kerlin – No, as we are very limited on time with all the activities we do.

Lucy – We have a standard letter for those contacting the shops.

Mr Kerlin – I second that. You've done a great job. Best of luck in the future.

Aqsa – Some P1 parents have expressed an interest in the PC but have no one to look after their children. Do we look at a Zoom alternative?

Eabhnat – We used to have children at meetings so can maybe look at that again. Not sure it would work in this setting as will be quite loud due to the size of the hall.

Agsa – Do parents have to attend all meetings?

Thomas – No, but they have to attend some. Will also be difficult to have your vote.

Eabhnat – Maybe they can come to some meetings and join the WhatsApp group to give their views. Can our new members leave their email address and phone number so we can add you.
