### **Headteacher's Report – Mr Kerlin**

#### **P.C update April 2025**

Head Teacher's Newsletter to be published for April and May containing information on recent School events and upcoming events. A new Newsletter is to be published at the start of June.

#### **Staffing update**

EAL Teacher Sidrah Hussain is off long-term sick. Linsey Nicholas now covering EAL support and Robyn McCallum is covering P7/6. We have Robyn secured on a long-term basis until about 2 weeks before the end of this term.

New staffing entitlement has changed from previous 16.8 FTE to 17.8FTE. This is a positive addition to the previous projections. We are expecting 2 full time teachers and a 0.2. It is unknown who our staff will be as of yet. I am expecting to hear about them this week. Class teacher information will be communicated to parents as part of report cards in June. We have had two probationers this year and I would like to thank them for their time at St Angela's. We will get 2 new probationers next year.

This year we had 14 classes. We are classifying for 13 classes next year, with 14 teachers. P1a will have 25 pupils with one teacher and P1b will have 33 pupils with 2 teachers as we legally cannot have 1 teacher in front of 33 P1 pupils.

This is the best classification for the cohort in front of us.

#### **Building**

No issues to report at present. I am applying for a grant for a graffiti artist to rejuvenate our hall and to make the boiler area look more appealing. Thanks to Thomas for sourcing metal through his work to put around the boiler to add the graffiti to. I have

received a quote from a graffiti artist of £1100. The work is to be carried out in September if the Area Partnership grant is successful.

### **Summer Trip**

Plans in place for summer trip on 5<sup>th</sup> June. Information to be sent out in coming weeks.

### **SAPC Update**

SAPC football is now finished for the year. Trials will take place in June for next year's team. We have made great progress with the SAPC. I am hoping that we can continue to fund the buses through the area partnership transport grant. However, it would be beneficial if the PC booked next years buses directly with SWCT. Thank you to Tom for all the work he does, and I hope we can continue to improve this working relationship.

### **RRS Accreditation**

We are now a Rights Respecting Schools Gold Award School. The RRS Gold celebration day to take place on 20<sup>th</sup> June.

### **School Colour Fund Run**

The fund run took place on 17<sup>th</sup> May. Thank to everyone who came along it was financially a success but also a great community day. Successful first event with approx. 200 taking part and £2600 raised for school funds. Thanks to everyone who came along it was financially a success but also a great community day. I'd like to give a special thanks to the **Graham's and the Pasternack's** who raised £700 and the other families who raised in the £100's. However the small donations were equally valuable and important and thanks to all of the families who came along and for the money they raised. All of it is greatly appreciated. We hope to make this a yearly event.

### **After School Care**

Danielle Campbell has now opened registration for her after school care, 'Danni's After School Care.' It is not yet clear when the opening will be. August would be a good natural start for this. So far this has been very welcomed in the community, especially next year's P1 parents.

We have modernised our school logo. This has been done primarily to improve the image quality but also to ensure that our logo can be used on products going further. In terms of this new badge being on uniform we have to allow the stock we already have, to run down first before we change to the new one, but I am not fussed about rushing this. Aqsa – I can go and buy anything that is needed.

Eabhnat – Were the chocolate coins bought at the cash and carry last year?

Aidan – I can do another cash & carry run if needed.

Aqsa - I'll price check the chocolate coins to see where is best to get them.

Eabhnat – Any idea how many we ordered?

Aqsa – There will be a receipt I can check.

Eabhnat – I know that we didn't have enough last year. I had made a note of that.

Are we contacting Newspapers?

Safa – I can contact Glasgow Life and possibly Glasgow Times.

Eabhnat – Actually the invite to the Glasgow Times should come from the PC as we've had previous contact.

Aqsa – and they hosted the awards we attended.

Safa – I will contact Glasgow Life.

Eabhnat – Thank you. I'll add Glasgow Times to the PC email list.

In previous years we've had a raffle with an adult prize at the Celebration Event. This has always been for general PC funds, not SALTIRE. If the group wants to organise an adult-centred raffle, please do, but I don't have capacity to be involved.

We will need more volunteers as we were paying people last year to run more of the activities. Perhaps, I could create a volunteer WhatsApp group with a link from the form? What are people's thoughts on that?

Fiona – A volunteer WhatsApp group from the form is a good idea.

Safa – You'd have to ensure the form is GDPR compliant.

Eabhnat – We also need a volunteer timetable for the event. With a WhatsApp group it might be more accessible for volunteers and they could ask questions on there with plenty to answer.

**Blue Sky –**

Eabhnat – I set up a Blue Sky account for the PC and have shared it with all of you. I also made a SALTIRE one but haven't shared yet as I am unsure whether we want separate ones or not. I wanted to discuss this.

Aqsa – I like the SALTIRE being separate as we do so much with SALTIRE.

Aidan – I think the opposite would be better. There would be no PC without SALTIRE & no SALTIRE without the PC. They're interconnected and also one account would make less duplication.

Paul – You are as well starting with just the PC account and see how it goes and you can always change if it suits better.

Fiona – With two separate accounts you would spend a lot of time cross posting and sharing each others posts which would be extra work.

Mr Kerlin - No one has complained about the lack of Twitter yet. So, I probably won't use any platform with the school until that changes and a need is identified. SALTIRE posts are different because you're trying to create an online presence to support funding applications.

Fiona – What is the culture with other primary schools using Twitter?

Mr Kerlin – I know Darnley doesn't use it.

Safa - I'm sure the Darnley PC uses Facebook.

Aqsa – The only reason I ever joined Twitter was to see what other schools were doing when I was looking at where to send my kids.

Mr Kerlin – Yes, it's only useful for people on the outside looking in.

Safa – The App SeeSaw that St Angela's use is a much better app. I prefer SeeSaw as the teachers are so active on it.

Fiona – Yes I would agree. Everything you want to see you can find on SeeSaw.

Safa – Yes, not much of a need for a second platform when SeeSaw is so active.

Eabhnat – Should we put a pin in it?

Fiona – Is anyone feeling strongly about going forward with this?

### **Spring Fling Feedback –**

Fiona – As I wasn't there was there anything that can be discussed. I had heard more volunteers as I know there is only so much the P7's will do.

### **P7 –**

Fiona – I think the prep for the leavers is all in hand.

Thomas – I made sure that the decorations bought can all be used again moving forward apart from a few that say leavers '25.

Fiona – Good.

Jacqueline – The nursery is going to help with us with the decor that they use for their graduation.

Mr Kerlin – The nursery have their graduation in the afternoon of the same day as the leavers ball.

Jacqueline – We wouldn't really have the time to decorate using their decorations then.

Mr Kerlin – If possible, Lisa has said that she is happy to share her decorations with us.

Thomas – We have gotten the P7's all a keyring with class of 25 and a wristband with the same. Both are in a bag together to give to them.

Mr Kerlin – How do the P1 to P6 parents sign up for volunteering at the Ball.

Mr Kerlin – The teachers at the Ball should not be counted in the ratio of adults per pupil. If it weren't for the staff attending last year the ratio would not have been right and we cannot have that. There will be 50 odd P7's attending therefore we need at least 6 volunteers.
