Standards and Quality Report

Sent to PC – approval required.

Building

heating working, no leaks just now, issue with fences

Fences - The fence along the "wooden path" needs to be replaced, short life left, unlikely to be replaced the length of the car park, need to have playground secure for safety, will need PC support for funding support in the near future.

Road Safety – Day of action Thursday 16th September.

Following the poor levels of adherence to our Car Free Zone, and concerns being raised over local parking behaviours, Police Scotland and NRS (Neighbourhood and Regeneration Services) facilitated a day of action on Thursday 16th September. We thank these groups for their support and we hope to see improved behaviours when transporting children to and from school.

We spoke about changing the traffic light signals before 9am and after 3pm but the council have said they can't be changed during school day and then changed back as they are on a set rotation.

We have an Active Travel Committee working on road safety too.

Thomas: The council could extend the fence on the traffic island to increase capacity for safe waiting.

Aidan: We will add this to our suggestions.

Church Rep

Meeting on 5th Nov – Fr Byrne and Fr Joe meeting me on Monday to discuss further. PC invited to attend. Fr Byrne is undertaking School chaplain work in the school and I will invite him to join our Parent Council as parish rep.

Appendix 2 - Cost of School Day Survey Results - Sept 2025

Results from the survey were shared and discussed.

Thomas made a donation for £100 towards Christmas Fayre, gratefully received.*

Aqsa: What if parents don't pay the kids don't get on the bus? That might incentivise parents to pay.

Natasha: Perhaps they don't pay because the child doesn't want to go.

Aidan: Some schools say, "if you don't pay, we assume you don't want to go" but I wouldn't like to exclude pupils for money reasons. We need communication from parents if they can't afford it and there are channels to get funds to go.

Safa: Are supports in place to help families with payment methods. Could we have a drop in session about information on how to pay.

Aidan: We can offer support, perhaps a drop in or support during parents nights from the PC

Agsa: We did that for the bus passes before and Paul helped someone apply.

Aidan: In the survey people said they are happy to pay between £10 and £25 for trips.

Lorna: don't think it's the amount – more problems with the system of payment.

Aqsa: it's also knowing that if you don't pay your kid still gets to go

Natasha: Is it that the trip to Ayr beach is the same each year?

Aidan: We're not going to Ayr this year as that is a factor. We will decide on other place

to go in the new year.

Lorna: Perhaps if we have a 3 year rolling list of places to go.

SALTIRE Update – Eabhnat Ní Laighin

Adult Workshops:

Our adult workshops have begun with cookery and pumpkin carving. The full adult calendar for the year is almost finalised and will be shared with families shortly.

Steering Group:

We hope to give the group more ownership of the grounds and the work undertaken. We have created four subgroups with responsibility for different areas.

The girls were also involved in recording for a Stirling University research project on 23rd September. The project is about disrupting hierarchies in learning, specifically in literacy. The lead researcher Jess Anderson attended the Celebration Event in June and was keen to document the project. It will feature it in the final dissertation film piece next year.

Pupil Work:

Our pupil workshops started with lots of clearing in the biodiversity meadow and the allotment, as well as mulching trees and refreshing the bark in the sensory garden.

Muddy Movers:

Muddy movers has started back for P1s with great success. So far they have done Apple picking in the orchard, we've visited the allotment and talked about the composters and had a go at turning them, we've made nature wands and done some 'magic' and this week we did Rangoli chalk art in the playground for Diwali. Thanks to Rachel for her continued work with this.

Funding:

We were successful in more funding applications:

- BUPA Staff selection Fund via Spiderarts £5000, £2000 for allotment and £3000 for outdoor play workshops with Spider Arts
- Co-op selected as one of their local causes for 25/26, members vote for us and the amount we get depends on the number of votes, but will be between £1000 £2000.
- Bupa Foundation Green Grant £2000

Allotment Development:

Sowing Seeds are booked in for November to build two more adult raised beds. Border and bark all 3 areas and help us build a shelter for the composting area including rain water collection. This will mean a significant improvement in how the allotment looks as well as increasing and sustaining our food growing capacity.

Composting:

Composting started again yesterday, thanks to Mrs Shaw for organising. Barrhead High have contacted us asking for help with composting food waste from school and will arrange to visit the site in the coming weeks.

Family Gardening Club:

A family gardening club will start next week running on Tuesdays 3- 4pm and a few Saturday morning dates 10-11am. All welcome.

Parent Council Business: Natasha Mirza

Minute Taker

Eabhnat: Labhaoise would like to thank the group for the opportunity to take minutes last year but will be unable to continue this year due to work and uni commitments. I am happy to do them as I am a co-opted member unless anyone else wants to.

Natasha: Rachel or I could do them if you can't attend.

Disclosure Scotland

Aidan – if you take on a regulated role you need a PVG, guidelines are loose but we'd want to err on the side of caution. Because of SALTIRE we have a core group already PVG'd. Discos are the difficulty. I think we need to be strategic about who gets PVGd. SLT are happy to be there for this disco until PVG membership is sorted out but teachers shouldn't be counted towards the adult: pupil ratio for PC events. Guidance and compliance needs to come from PC, we'll have PVG and Non-PVG parent volunteers. Non pvg'd volunteers need to be with the masses only, along with PVG members. This is to protect volunteers themselves as well as pupils.

There is a difference of need for Routine events v one off events. Autumn disco is a one off event each year.

Lorna: If you have regular volunteers it would be worthwhile to PVG them.

Aidan: However, if you're PVGing volunteers it puts more responsibility on them.

Thomas: You need at least 4 adults in the hall

Aidan: there was talk of tattoos

Natasha: Rachel has said she can do that

Aidan: The person selling would need to be a PVG person because they have direct one to one contact with pupils.

Safa: Should we PVG all PC members

Aidan: I don't think that's a bad idea

Thomas: I'm happy to do that

Safa: I can do that too, I will contact you Eabhnat

Aidan: The ratio is 1:10

Thomas: It's normally 65 – 80 children at early disco and the later disco is max 90 pupils

Natash so 10 for the second and 7 for the second

Aidan: it needs to be set on ticket sales and we need to be strict about the deadline. If a child walks in the door and puts it over the limit you need another adult. The volunteer form needs to go out.

Natasha: we were waiting for a question about PVG

Aidan: You could ask "are you willing to be PVGd?"

Aidan: (Reading from the training notes)

Thomas: we're lucky because the school is a small space

Aidan: Staff can cover toilets for this disco

Parish Representation - covered

Bus Funding

Eabhnat: The area partnership £500 bus fund is for one off bus trips not a series of trips over the course of a year so there has been some confusion about the application. We have applied for £500 to cover busses until the start of march, which is in this financial year. This would count as our application for the year as organisations are expected to apply only once. We will need to discuss covering busses beyond March in the new year but it doesn't feel like a good use of our one area partnership application.

Aidan: Also, it only benefits 10 children.

Eabhnat: Yes, that was another point, PC funds should benefit all pupils as much as possible.

Aidan: Other schools ask parents to collect children and deliver them to Nethercraigs or the children walk there. We're a little further away and it is nice to know that the bus will be there and all pupils can make it. We could also ask parents to contribute to bus hire, however it doesn't impact all pupils who do Tuesday night and Thursday nights football and currently pay £25 Sept - Dec.

Aqsa: If they went elsewhere they'd pay at least £30 a month

Thomas: One place I know kids pays £11 a week

Aidan: We will need to bring it back to the table in April

Sign Language / Makaton

Safa: There are free BSL resources available and I wondered if the school would be interested in them. I could send them on.

Aidan: We currently have no BSL users and Makaton is more accessible pupils with more complex needs.

Lorna: Makaton is used by a lot of ASN units and is supported across GCC.

Safa: Also Families Connect offer resources for a P1 parenting course. They have run it at St Albert's Primary. I could email the details to the school if you'd be interested.

Aidan: Yes please, thanks.

Safa: If there's anything else I can help with let me know.

Autumn Disco

Thomas: Crisps, drink, chocolate treat last year

Aidan: You could ask for free donations. Mark Paton, community liaison for Sainsbury's donated snacks for the Colour Run.

Thomas: I could ask friends for staff discount at Sainsbury's

Lorna: best to get snacks at last minute when you know numbers.

Thomas: And get extra because people show up on the night Are we doing best costume? I'll get boxes of celebrations for the prizes, two prizes for each disco.

Agsa: Keep it similar as previous years

Aidan: 100 children have bought tickets, £257 taken in so far. It will go up with a reminder.

Aqsa: it only went out yesterday

Lorna: we'll talk about it in assembly too and promote it

Natasha: I'll need to adapt last year's email for volunteers. Do we have glowsticks?

Aqsa: There might be some left in the cupboard

Aidan: They will need to be told to bring cash for glow sticks

Thomas: Tell them just a couple of pounds. Plus put the pick up time in bold in communication.

Aidan: The outdoor lights have been fixed and are bright so that won't be an issue.

Natasha: what do we do for music?

Thomas: We have a boom box and lights and someone makes a Spotify playlist

Aidan – clean version of songs!

Leavers' Hoodies

Natasha: Luciana said the leavers hoodies have been ordered and will be with children in time for residential trip.

Aidan: Yes even with the new date, we managed to get it all prepared in time.

Actions: check for glow sticks, buy prizes, snacks bought closer to the time, volunteer form sent out, volunteers emailed and asked if they'd be willing to be PVGd. Volunteers organised according to PVG status.







. What class(es) is your child in?






How would you describe the schools approach to asking for financial contributions





Which of the following items, events or activities have the biggest financial impact on your family?








I know how I would go about applying for free school meals and clothing grants




I think there is enough support for families finding it difficult to afford school costs








It is difficult to afford all of the things my child needs for school











Do you regularly support the Playground Draw at the end of each month?





Do you think the Playground Draw is a good way of raising funds for school?











Do you think that families should pay for school trips? (To the Pantomime at Christmas, Summer trip to Ayr Beach etc)






What is a fair amount to pay in a year for a child to attend a Christmas Trip AND a Summer Trip.
