

Reference/Bibliography List – Harvard Style



All of the books, magazines and websites you use in your project need to be referenced. We are choosing to use the Harvard style as this is commonly used in schools and universities across the country. In Harvard style the reference list is arranged alphabetically by author's last name (or equivalent for the particular reference).

Book, e.g Rowling, J.K. (2005)

AUTHOR or EDITOR's LAST NAME, INITIALS. (year of publication) *Title of Book taken from title page and publication details on the reverse*, City of publication: Publisher.

Example:

Rowling, J.K. (2005) *'Harry Potter: and the Half-Blood Prince'*, London: Bloomsbury Publishing Plc

Book Chapter or section from Edited Book

CHAPTER AUTHOR's LAST NAME, INITIALS. (year of publication) Title of Chapter. IN: EDITOR's LAST NAME, INITIALS. (Eds) *Title of book taken from title page and publication details on the reverse*, City of publication: Publisher. Page numbers as appropriate.

Example:

Evans, C and Lucy, S. (1992) *'Building a character'*. IN: Evans, C. (Eds.) *'Acting and Theatre'*. London: Usborne Publishing LTD, pp14-16.

Web Page

AUTHOR's LAST NAME, INITIALS. (Year of publication if available) *Title of webpage* [online]. Place of publication, Publisher (if available). Available from: URL [Last accessed date].

Example:

Lochardil Primary Website. Lochardil Primary School, Inverness. Available from: <http://lochardilprimary.org.uk> [Last accessed 20/02/2012].

PLEASE NOTE:

When no author is given for a webpage, the reference starts with the title.
