


All Saints Primary & CLB August News



P.E. Information and Kit



- Dark Self-Coloured Shorts/Tracksuit bottoms/leggings.
- School Polo Shirt/T-shirt.
- School sweatshirt

These should be brought in bags for PE and the children will change into them. We have excellent changing room facilities within the school and time is allocated for children to change.

To make things easier and quicker for changing, children could wear polo shirt and sweatshirt on PE days rather than shirt and tie.

Please make sure all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name on them.

Children will be going outside for one period of PE this term so please make sure your child has a waterproof jacket.

Primary 4 pupils will be taking part in the Inverclyde Council Swimming Programme this term so will therefore only have one period of PE.

Following Inverciyde Council Health and Safety procedures, all jewellery must be removed for PE lessons, including all piercings. If your child has difficulty removing earrings, then we advise that they do not wear them to school on PE days. Pupils cannot take part in PE lessons if they have false nails. Please be mindful of this.



Attendance and Late Coming



We place a real importance on attendance and last year we successfully raised attendance throughout the school.

Unsettled friendship groups, emotional and behaviour difficulties, unsuccessful learning and lower employment opportunities can result from poor attendance.

Breakfast Club



Our breakfast club is on every morning from 8 o'clock and it is free for those in receipt of a clothing grant.

Access to the Breakfast Club is through the doors at the canteen at the back of the school. From 8 a.m. there will be someone there to let the children in. Please do not use the front door to access Breakfast Club.

Even though all children get free school meals this does not give them access to free breakfast club.

You need to be in receipt of the Clothing grant for free breakfast club access. If you don't qualify for a clothing grant then the breakfast club costs £1 per day, paid through Parent Pay

As well as a healthy breakfast, Lee, our sports coach plans fabulous activities for the children to participate in. These include team games, archery, problem solving challenges and fitness activities.

We would like to see more children attend, particularly now the mornings are lighter.

We may even get up on the pitch for some outdoor breakfast challenges.
