We understand that there will be times when your child can not attend school, however our school vision is that every child has every chance to succeed. #### **School Uniform**

#### Pick Up and Drop Off

#### UNCRC Article 3 The best interest of the child must be a priority

Our playgrounds are supervised from 8.45 a.m. by Pupil Support Assistants and members of the Senior Management Team. Please do not send your child to school before this time unless they are attending our school breakfast club which is open from 8.00 a.m.

To safeguard our children at all times, please do not enter the playground or gather on the side stairs of the school when dropping off and picking up your child.

In light of recent incidents surrounding safety of children, staff will ask you to leave the playground as we need all children to be safe from harm and we cannot guarantee this if there are adults in the playground who are unfamiliar.

We have elderly neighbours and ask that you be respectful of them when parking around the school. We have a park and stride facility on Blairmore Road.

Please use the school crossing patrol. We now have 2 crossing patrol staff. One at the top of Blairmore Road and the other on Kilmacolm Road. Children and families should use these crossings to ensure safe routes to school.

Please make sure your child knows end of day pick-up arrangements. Our school office currently has only one member of staff at the end of the school day who is required to ensure taxi children are picked up safely. All other children will come out the school with their classes to ensure safety at all times.

Our school office is staffed from 8.30 until 4.00 pm. If you call out with these hours you will be put straight through to answer machine where they will be picked up by office staff in the morning.

### **Cost of school Day**

We are very mindful of the cost of the school day. So we make every effort to keep the cost of additional activities to a minimum and we are thankful to our Parent voice Group who are very supportive.

Last year we spent a total of £2464.00 on buses to various events within the school. The cost of this was supported by donations from the Parent Voice Group and St Laurence's Parish.

This year we will be unable to fully subsidise educational visits so we will be asking parents to contribute to this through adding funds to their <u>Parent Pay</u> account.

#### PE Kit

#### UNCRCArticle 24 Every child has the right to the best possible health



We have wonderful changing facilities so the children can bring PE Kit to get changed. Children often benefit from changing out of their PE kit. To help with pace, children should wear school polo shirt and sweat shirt on these days. Please label all items of clothing. Please only wear dark leggings or joggers for PE and avoid stripes or branded logos as items often get left behind.

Following Inverclyde Council Health and Safety procedures, all jewellery must be removed for PE lessons, including all piercings. If your child has difficulty removing earrings, then we advise that they do not wear them to school on PE days. Pupils cannot take part in PE lessons if they have false nails. Please be mindful of this.

#### **Breakfast Club**

Our breakfast club runs from 8 a.m. until 8.45 a.m. every day. You need to be in receipt of the Clothing grant for free breakfast club access. If you don't qualify for a clothing grant then the breakfast club costs £1 per day, paid through Parent Pay. Applications for clothing grants can be accessed through Inverciyde Council's: Clothing Grant Application

Entrance to the breakfast club is through the side gates of the school and down the stairs at the amphitheatre and in the door at the school canteen. NOT the front door.

#### Lunches

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Please look over the lunch menus with your child and help them to choose what they would like. We are on week 1 of the menu which has been sent out.

#### **Snacks**

Please provide your child with water for the classroom and a small healthy snack for playtime. Fizzy drinks are not allowed as we are a health promoting school.

#### **Nut Free School**

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As we have children in school who have a nut allergy, we are a nut free zone. Please do not send your child to school with snacks containing nuts or with Nutella on sandwiches. This helps us to ensure that we keep all of our children safe at all times.



#### **Toys in School**

Please don't send your child to school with toys as they can often get lost or damaged and children become upset. They can also be a distraction during learning time. These items should be left at home.

#### **Active Schools**

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We work closely with our partners Active Schools to provide a range of after school and lunchtime clubs. Details of these will be sent out shortly. Last year 72% of pupils in the school benefitted from participation in activities with Active Schools which were supported by our very own school staff.

#### P7 Residential

Last year our P7 Residential Trip was fully funded from Educational Scotland Pupil Equity Funding and cost £9940.00. This year our funding is completely committed to additional staffing including one Full time teacher, one part time teacher, a part time Nurture Teacher and Health and Wellbeing Coach, so we will not be able to fund a Residential trip for P7.

We will shortly be in touch with our P7 parents through a Microsoft Form and along with consultation from staff and pupils, we will look to provide alternative outdoor learning experiences for our pupils.
