Attendance

Thank you for continuing to support your child's learning by ensuring they attend school regularly.

Absence from school affects your child's learning, relationships and self-confidence. They do not get the same opportunities of success that others do. When a child is regularly absent they continually have to play catch up with their learning and this affects the pace at which they learn and the progress they make.

We are aware that children often want to have a 'wee day off' however this can significantly impact on the progress they make. Children with poor attendance are found to have gaps in their learning and this is evident through assessments.

Don't be the barrier to your child's achievements. Every child deserves every chance to be successful.



Latecoming

Being late for school has a significant impact on how your child presents at school each day.

Sometimes only being a few minutes late sets the child on a difficult journey for the day. At times they don't want to walk in class late or always be that one child who doesn't get to school on time and therefore misses the start of the day

activities, including check in and registration.

Please get into a routine in the morning, set an earlier alarm, switch off the devices and perhaps even get into the routine of an early bed time. Many of our children report that they are tired as they don't go to bed until late. All of these things help your child become a successful learner.
