




Recipe Of The Month
Mrs. Barney

Have a sweet time of it over the Easter break by creating this lemon meringue crunch.

Method

9

Whisk the egg white until stiff. Add the remaining sugar gradually.

Ingredients

1 Set oven to 190°C (Gas Mark 5)

Spread over the lemon sauce and bake until crisp and golden.

20g butter

2 Grease dish

11

Leave to cool down

4 digestive biscuits

3 Crush the biscuits in a plastic bag with a rolling pin

12

Wash up

100g caster sugar

4 Melt butter in a pot and add the biscuit crumbs

13.

Enjoy responsibly.

1 egg separated

5 Press into the base of your dish

15ml lemon juice

6 Put 50g of sugar in a pot with the egg yolk, lemon juice and water

100ml water

7 Blend cornflour with a little water in a cup and add to pot.

15g cornflour

8 Bring the mixture to the boil and pour over base.
