Scottish Waltz




In this unit, you will play several Scottish melodies and you will discover something that many of them use. Using a rhythm bank and a series of notes you will create your own Scottish waltz composition.




Mull of Kintyre






PENTATONIC SCALE

The notes used are the following:




You can use the notes at any octave – squares and triangles are fine too!


Come up with a five note sequence (in a different order to the one above!) using the pentatonic scale....







Make sure your composition finishes on the longest note that you can choose.



















WALTZ COMPOSITION


