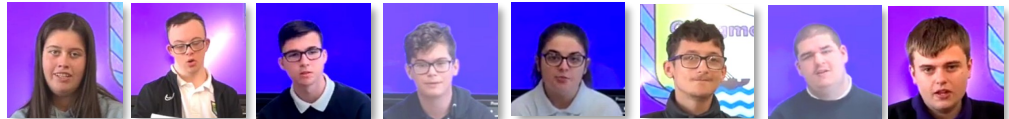
We've worked really hard to make this issue of the Craigie Record. We've made up the interview questions, we took pictures and we've made up stories. We hope you like it!

Do you like the Prime Minister Liz Truss?

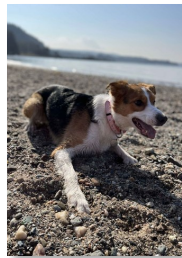

Irn Bru or Coke?

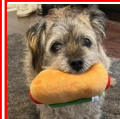

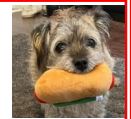

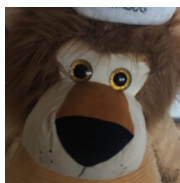

Recipe of the Month Mrs Barney



Make your tea break that little bit classier by enjoying your cuppa with one of these delicious home made Scottish biscuits!

Ingredients

50g butter
75g plain flour
25g caster sugar

Oven Setting 190C/Gas Mark 5

Method

1 Place all ingredients into a food processor and pulse

until the mixture comes together as a dough.

2 Knead on a lightly floured surface.

3 Roll out to 0.5cm thick. Use a cutter to cut 8 rounds and place on a baking tray.

4 Bake for 8-10 minutes until just golden brown. Remove from oven and place on cooling tray.

5 Sprinkle with caster sugar or sandwich with jam.

6 Enjoy responsibly.
