Students will continue to develop their values and leadership skills by taking forward change projects.

Departments will identify expected progress in S1-S3 across all subjects, ensuring a smooth transition to an appropriate Senior Phase level of study.

Closing the attainment gap between the most and least disadvantaged children.



Review Pupil Equity tracking and monitoring processes and improve communication surrounding support strategies.

Targeted support for young people through the Achievement Room.

S1-S3 and S4-S6 mentoring programmes to continue for targeted groups of students.

Parental Engagement Strategy developed with three events taking place across the year. Communication improved with parents and carers.



Improvement in children and young people's health and wellbeing.



Departments to reflect on the Nurture Principles, selecting one to embed and share good practice on throughout the year.

Staff training and development to focus on Trauma Informed Practice and Attachment Theory.

Priorities identified in previous session's student wellbeing tracker to be taken forward across the school: building student confidence and first-aid programmes for students.

Refresh attendance policy in line with local authority developments.



Improvement in employability skills and sustained positive destinations for all young people.



Post school data analysed and interventions made at regular points in the school year.

All subject areas supported to develop links with employers and make relevant use of online resources, in particular *MyWOW* to demonstrate employment links.

Improve work experience availability, ensuring targeted students are offered placements.

Explore various platforms to help young people profile their skills.

Embed Skills Framework in all departments and ensure S2 and S3 students record key skills.
