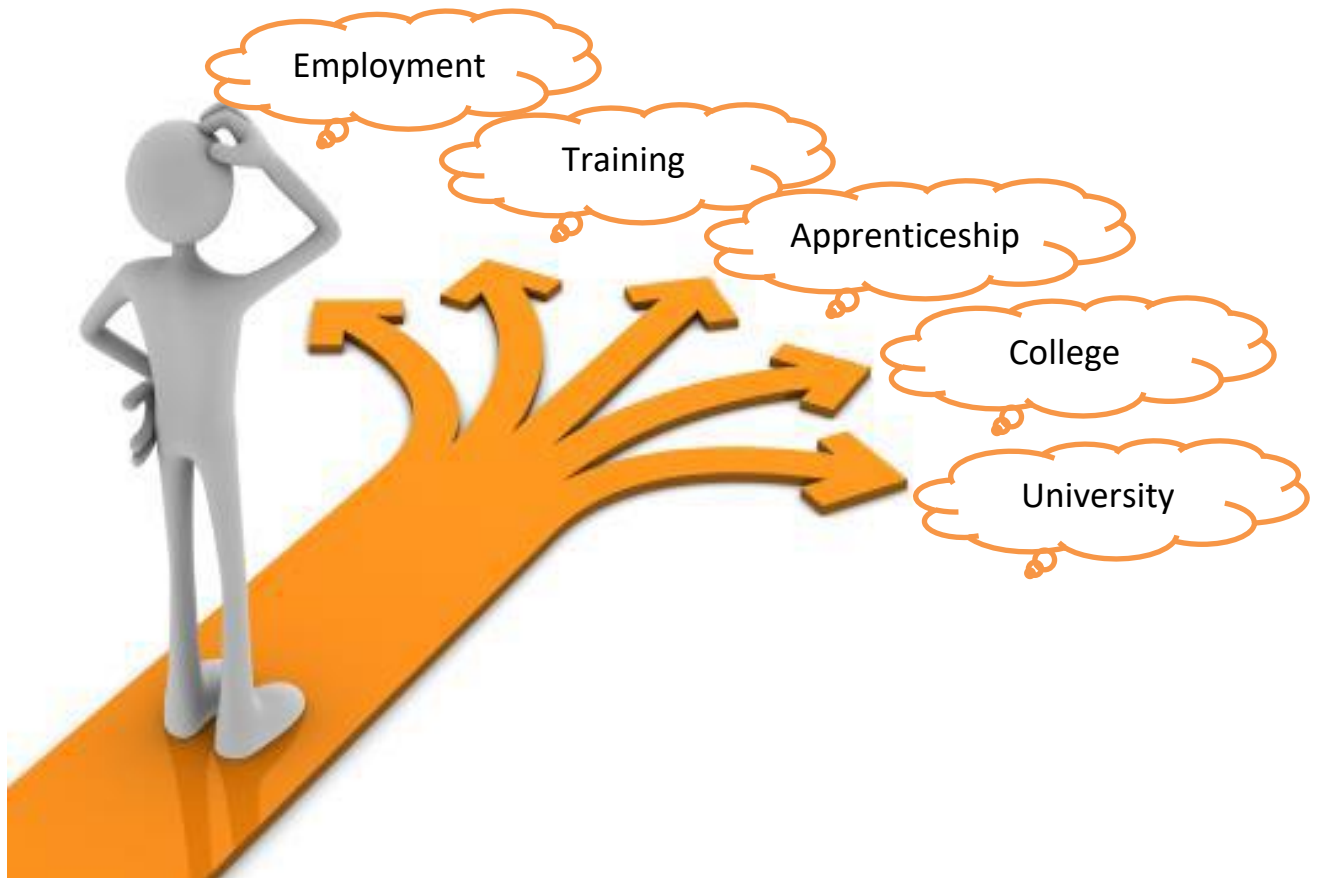

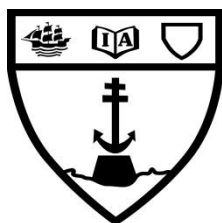

INTRODUCTION

Inverclyde Academy has a proven track record of supporting its pupils into positive school leaver destinations. Key to this success is how we support all of our pupils at important times of transition.

In S4, we encourage all our young people to achieve at least 6 National Qualifications whilst still engaging with core PE, RMPS and PSE.

In S5/6, we have greater expectations of pupils as leaders in their school environment. We want to utilise the strengths of all seniors and create opportunities for them to contribute to the school.

We hope that the information in this booklet is helpful and fully supports you to make key subject choices as you move from S3/4/5 to S4/5/6.

We wish you every success on the next step of your learning journey.

Understanding the Option Choice Form

We offer free option choices at Inverclyde Academy. This means that pupils can choose any combination of subjects they wish and we will endeavour to fit the timetable around them. However, there are some restrictions to take into account. **Where we are unable to match your combination of subjects to the timetable, we will use one (or both) of your reserve subjects so you must pick them carefully.** Do not assume the reserves will not be used.

As started in session 2021-22, your options form will be completed electronically. However, we will send home a paper copy for you to use in discussions with those at home before you make your final choices.

Number of subjects required

Pupils must follow a set number of courses in S4, S5 and S6 as indicated below:

- S4-6 – 6 courses plus core time if not studying any Highers
- S5/6 – 5 courses if taking at least one Higher
- S6 only – 5 courses (minus one for each Adv Higher to a minimum of 3)

Consortium Courses

Inverclyde Academy is part of a consortium that includes all Inverclyde secondary schools and West College Scotland. If you are unable to study a course at Inverclyde Academy, we **may** be able to arrange for you to take the course at a consortium school (mostly in S6). However, columns and choices may need to be flexible to secure the courses you most desire or require.

West College Scotland also offers courses in subjects which schools do not. Places for these courses are limited and more details will be available during the application process in April.

S5/6 pupils must be aware that the college selection process will determine whether or not you gain a place on these courses so you are advised to make your Guidance Teacher aware of your back up subject at school should you be unsuccessful. Bear in mind that you may not get a place in your preferred school subject if you need to use it as back-up at a later stage.

Foundation Apprenticeships – S5/6 only

West College Scotland is working in partnership with Skills Development Scotland to deliver exciting Foundation Apprenticeship courses for S5 & S6 pupils in our local schools. They are aimed at pupils who have completed National 5s in S4 or are working towards all National 5 level qualifications in S5 as **you must be capable of working at Higher level by S6.**

A Foundation Apprenticeship will take an S5 pupil two years to complete, and is the same level of learning as a Higher (SCQF level 6). As pupils are working towards their qualification, they will spend time out of school at college and with a local employer. This is the equivalent of one subject column in S5 and S6. However, the Foundation Apprenticeship programme is also now offering shorter duration delivery models for S6 pupils that are the equivalent of 2 subject columns.

Why should you consider a Foundation Apprenticeship?

Here are just a few reasons why you should consider taking a Foundation Apprenticeship:

- Gain a qualification recognised by employers, colleges and universities;
- Get the hands-on experience and skills that employers want;
- Get a taste of your chosen career before you leave school whilst achieving N5s and Highers;
- Get an option for accelerated entry to a Modern Apprenticeship after school;
- Enhance your application and personal statement for college or university;
- Develop self-confidence, problem-solving and leadership skills.

As with other college courses, you should ensure you have a back up subject in mind should you be unsuccessful in gaining a place. However, if you are interested in applying for a Foundation Apprenticeship, you can find out more at:

HNC Classes – S6 only

S6 pupils who have the necessary entry requirements can opt for an HNC infill course, which will be studied at West College Scotland for approximately 2-3 days per week as indicated below. This is a measure of our commitment to “Opportunities for All”.

Any S6 pupil opting for an HNC is advised to opt for at least 2 more additional subjects to be studied on the remaining days at school. **It is important to note that pupils are responsible for catching up with all work missed in school when they are out at college.**

Important Information

Sixth Year students will build on their Higher successes in Fifth Year by progressing to Advanced Higher. **Higher and Advanced Higher courses not mentioned overleaf are likely to be offered on a consortium basis.** Students should give serious consideration to the enrichment offered by enrolling for such a course in a different educational establishment while retaining strong links with the base school.

National Qualification courses are no longer made up of individual units. However, pupils can still achieve stand-alone units where they are not being entered for a whole course award. Units assess minimum competence only and are assessed on a pass/fail basis.

If you complete a whole course award, you are not awarded any individual units but all course passes are graded at A, B or C level. Where a grade D is achieved, this indicates that the course has been completed but not passed. It is what is known as a course award and may not be accepted by colleges, universities or employers.

Using your prior results

Look carefully at your results for the different areas assessed in your most recent report. Think about which subjects are your most successful and which departments are congratulating you on your hard work and effort in these areas. Consider your progress in these subjects and the success you could see next year if you were to take this subject at the level above. Your past success in subjects will be of great help in your decisions for the following year.

Making the choice

When choosing your courses you must decide what subjects and level of course would suit you best. To help you make your choice, you should consider your abilities, future career needs and interests. **You should find out which courses and levels of qualification are needed for the college, university, apprenticeship or employment pathway you have in mind.** Do not assume you know what they will be looking for; you could be surprised by some of the entry requirements so ensure you have done your research before making your choices. Discussing your ideas and research with subject teachers can also be of huge benefit as they know a great deal about the pathways linked to each area.

You should also bear in mind that **pupils are not permitted to 'crash' new subjects in S4 or S5.** In these years, you must make choices based on the subjects you are already taking. Opportunities to pick up new subjects or 'crash' as it is often known may be available in S6 if relevant to your pathway.

Equal Opportunities

Young people used to be misled into thinking that certain subjects and careers were better suited to girls and others to boys. PSE lessons about the dangers of stereotyping have helped to encourage students to be open-minded when making subject and career choices. The careers and lifestyles of all are changing. Employers nowadays are most concerned about getting the right person for the job. Your choice of subjects and career should be based on your skills, abilities, interests, personality and health.

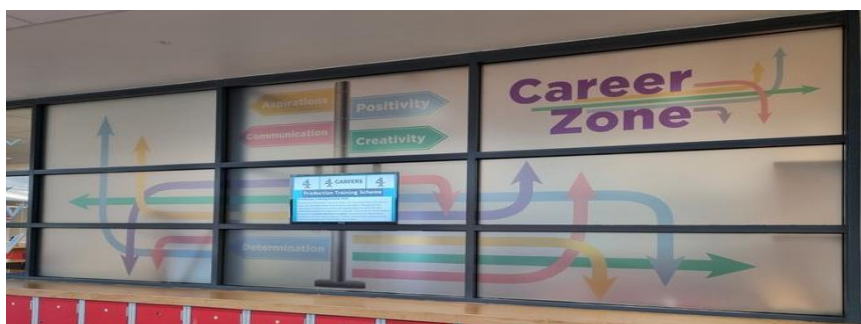
Christmas Leavers

Students whose sixteenth birthday falls between 1st October and 28th February of S5 must stay in full-time education until Christmas – **unless you have had a Personalised Learning Package approved by the Education Authority**. For more advice on this, please speak to your Pupil Support Teacher.

Curriculum for Excellence is built on pupil learning from the ages of 3 up to 18. We strongly advise all of our pupils to remain in education, for as long as possible, unless they have secured a positive school leaver destination such as a suitable college place, apprenticeship or full-time employment.

If you are intending to leave school at Christmas in S5, you should manage to complete one or even two units per subject before leaving. Provided your class work is up to date, you will receive recognition of these achievements when the SQA certificates are issued in August. You can carry on these courses later at college if you wish.

Please note that Christmas leavers are not permitted to be full-time college students until January of the leaving year unless approved by the local education authority as part of a Personalised Learning Package.



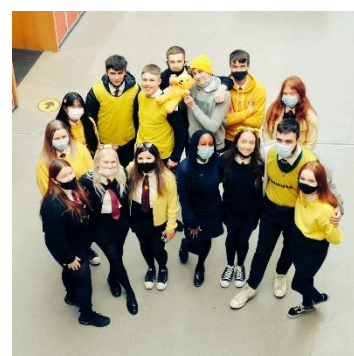
Senior School Life

Summary of points to remember

- Have a clear pathway that you want to follow and make sure you have researched it fully. Find out about the entry requirements needed for any jobs, apprenticeships, college or university courses that you are considering. Make sure your information is up to date.
- Use your exam results carefully - see previous information.
- Choose subjects you are good at and enjoy. Be realistic about what you are able to do - there is little point in taking a subject which has caused you serious difficulty in the past.
- Choose the type of course that best suits your abilities.

Are you:

- able to work on your own, e.g. for independent study?
- better at practical work than written work?
- prepared to study and work hard for a Higher?
- Discuss your options with other people. Ask them for information, help and advice - but remember you must make the final decision for yourself.
