
INTRODUCTION

Through a range of leadership roles and experiences, we aim to promote key values such as respect, responsibility, equality and success. These opportunities help our pupils to develop skills for life and work, build character, and contribute meaningfully to our school and wider community.

This guide will give you all the information you need to get involved with pupil leadership opportunities within our school.



INTRODUCTION

At Inverclyde Academy we aim to promote and provide the following:

- Leadership opportunities that are embedded throughout learning and teaching, helping all young people grow in confidence and develop their understanding of themselves as leaders within the school and the wider community.
- Students are encouraged to take the lead across all areas of school life including learning, wellbeing, and extra-curricular activities.
- Young people are recognised as important contributors to the life of the school, with opportunities to be involved in decision-making, school improvement, and future planning.

SUCCESS



Committee Chairpersons = PEF Principal Teachers
Committee Members = Class Teachers

Pupil Senior Leadership Team

The PSLT team is made up of pupils from S4, S5 and S6 who have demonstrated exceptional leadership throughout their time in Inverclyde Academy.

Key Responsibilities:

- To work directly with school management on school improvement
- To represent pupil voice and interests to school leadership
- To lead and manage our House Captains, Subject Ambassadors and Pupil Parliament Committees

APPLY

To become a member of PSLT when you progress to the senior phase, you must have contributed significantly to the improvement of Inverclyde Academy through involvement within any of the many leadership opportunities contained within this booklet.

House Captains

The role of House Captain is open to any S1–S6 pupil who consistently demonstrates our school values. House Captains represent their houses, support peers, assist at whole school events, and help improve the house system through event planning and token management.

Key Responsibilities:

- S1 House token distribution and collection
- **S2** Compassionate Inverclyde Kindness Fund Project
- S3 Compassionate Inverclyde Back Home Boxes Project
- \$4 School Event Catering
- S5/6 Manage house boxes and display boards, coordinate house activities and oversee junior house captain projects

APPLY

To become a House Captain you must complete an application at the start of the year or speak to Mr. Campbell.

Subject Ambassadors

The role of subject ambassador is open to anyone from S1-S6. There are two BGE and two Senior Phase Ambassadors for each subject.

Key Responsibilities:

- Leading by example, motivating participation in your subject area
- Planning and overseeing subject events/activities and clubs
- Gather pupil voice on learning and teaching in your subject
- Act as a bridge between pupils and subject staff
- Encouraging student involvement within your subject at events/clubs

APPLY

To become a Subject Ambassador you must go through the application process set out by the subject Principal Teacher.

Pupil Parliament

Our pupil parliament has many opportunities for Inverclyde Academy pupils to take on leadership roles within committees to lead school improvement.

Anti-Bullying



Pupils involved in this group are keen to support the anti-bullying message in Inverclyde Academy and will be involved in a range of activities to raise awareness and understanding around bullying. Pupils will contribute to/and share information through presentations during PSE and assemblies to ensure that pupils know how to report incidents of bullying and what to expect when reporting bullying incidents. They will also promote a common language and understanding around bullying - staff and pupils will use this language.

The Promise



This group aims to support care-experienced young people (CEYP) by building positive, non-crisis relationships with key agencies such as educational psychology, social work, and The Promise. It also seeks to create a safe, inclusive lunchtime space where CEYP can connect with peers in similar situations.

Period Pride



Pupils involved in this committee are responsible for supporting and promoting Period Dignity across the school and local community. Key responsibilities include: Stocking and maintaining feminine hygiene product storage areas across the school, presenting to visitors about the cause at school events i.e. Parents Evening, attending learning events, visiting Primary schools to deliver lessons, developing PSE lessons, presenting to staff at assemblies, working with community partners on projects across Inverciyde

Thrift Shop



The IA school thrift shop supports sustainability and affordability by offering gently used or new uniforms, clothing, shoes, and bags. It helps families manage costs while promoting reuse and reducing waste, fostering an eco-conscious school culture. **Key Responsibilities include:** Sorting through stock, tidying, visual merchandising, opening and closing the shop on Thursdays at lunchtime.

SCRAN Group



The aim of our group is to increase pupils' access to fruit and veg throughout the school day. Those involved in the SCRAN group will commit to one of the following sub-groups:

1. Magic Breakfast Fruit Group

This group helps choose the fruit offered at breakfast and takes responsibility for tidying up after the breakfast session at 9am.

2. Fruit & Veg Parcel Group

Members meet once a week at lunchtime to make up fruit and vegetable parcels for pupils. They also help plan the contents for the following week's parcels.

3. Smoothie Group

Led by senior pupils, this group prepares and serves smoothies every Friday morning at interval. They plan the recipes during Period 2 and clean the equipment during Period 3.




