


Our School Improvement Plan is a list of the most important things we want to work on and get better at this year. There are 4 main priorities we want to focus on to make our school even better.

Numeracy



Teachers are learning about the Inverclyde Numeracy Framework to help everyone learn maths step by step.



Teachers and Nursery staff will learn from each other and from maths experts.

We'll make special tasks for children who need more challenge in maths.

Teachers will check to see what's working and make changes if needed.

Literacy



Teachers are learning new ways to teach writing, spelling, and grammar. They'll use fun games, word lists, and activities to help you learn.

We're creating a plan so everyone learns spelling and grammar in the same way.



Some classes will try out new ways of learning.



In nursery, we'll build your reading and writing skills through fun with sounds, talking, drawing, and remembering.



We'll add fun reading, writing, and counting activities indoors and outdoors.



Staff will plan and check learning carefully.

We'll listen to your ideas and keep improving together.

Interdisciplinary Learning

Teachers will plan topics the same way across the school, highlighting MetaSkills.

We'll make sure they cover important ideas from around the world.



We'll ask what's working and make changes if needed.

'Every moment counts!'




We'll work with families to choose how to spend money to help everyone take part in trips, clubs, and learning.

Improve Health and Wellbeing





We will launch our 'Respect Me' anti-bullying charter.


Teachers are learning how to better support children who need extra care.

Teachers will keep learning about fairness and inclusion.


Pupils will help lead ideas to celebrate different cultures and promote kindness for all.







Shared language of skills

The Promise


Our pupil leaders will share the Pinkie Promise at assembly.
