INTRODUCTION

The parents/carers were consulted via a Survey Monkey in September 2018. The results are as follows:


Survey period: 9-26 September 2018




Q3. Listed below are the different methods of communication currently used to keep you informed of school news and events. Please tick those which you use.


Q4. Would you be interested in a school App? If yes, please respond to question 5. If no, please proceed to question 6.

Written messages or phone calls if a child's behaviour is not as good as it should be even minor issues so these can be discussed at home. I feel I only hear my child's version of events and then have to read between the lines to find out what might have happened really.

I think it would be helpful if important events such as meet the teacher (very important to me) could be offered as a drop in with several sessions or Monday - Friday before and after school for 1 week. Sometimes it comes across that the school May forget that a lot of parents work

Create an App. Not all parents use Twitter.

More notice for things happening if possible

Vary events to have them on different days so working parents can attend

Doing pretty well - at a previous school we had classroom representatives who acted as a go between between teacher and parents- that parent would run a Whattsup group which would communicate any thing the teacher needed and vice versatility- saved the teacher from being bombarded with a loads of similar questions

As a result of the survey, the following actions have been put in place:

97.83% of parents said they engaged with Parents' Evening -this is the highest form of communication	Parents' Evenings will continue in the school.
89.13% of parents said they engaged with Twitter, the 2 nd highest method of preferred communication with the school	The school, nursery, class and STEM Club accounts will continue to be active.
Email, Twitter and text messages were recorded as the preferred methods of communication	Email, Twitter and text messages* will continue to be used to communicate with parents. *more messages will be sent to parents via the school app (as they are free of charge, Groupcall text messages will be sent in emergency situations)
Over 90% of parents/carers said they would be interested in a school app	The school app launched on 1st May, the parents/carers were asked for feedback at the Parents' Evening on the 16th May. The feedback was extremely positive.
The parents said that the following would be the most important features of the app: Calendar of school/class events, important announcements	Calendar of school/class events, important announcements have all been included as features on the school app.
The highlights from comments from the parents/carers: 'open days for parents', 'occasional sessions in class to see how the children are getting on', 'further guidance on how we can continue current learning when the child is at home', 'teaching parents how to teach things like maths the same way they are taught at school'	The school plan to continue with 'showcase events' where parents/carers can spend time in the class/school to see the 'learning in action'. The school plan to introduce more 'advice' re learning at home/school via videos on Twitter and the school app (via a school You Tube page).

Sometimes it comes across that the school may forget that a lot of parents work' 'Variety of times of events due to us both being full time working parents, activities directly after school we can't attend' 'Vary events to have them on different days so working parents can attend'	The teachers have a Working Time Agreement, which protects their working week. Parent/carer events that are held out with the core school hours are agreed at the start of the session. This ensures that the staff are not working beyond their 35 hour working week. The school has tried where possible to vary the days/times of events, however, we appreciate that this will not suit all parents.

A Parental Engagement Session was held in the school on Tuesday 19^{th} March 2019, with the school and the Parent Partnership.

1. School II	mprovement Plan	A target linked to Parental Engagement will be detailed on the School Improvement Plan for Session 2019-20 for each priority.

1. 6 Week Targeted Support	A new model of support will be put in place from August 2019 - the parents/carers of the children who will be receiving targeted support will be invited in to attend sessions with the Support for Learning teacher and their child. The aim is to give the parents/carers advice/strategies on how to support their child at home with their learning.
2. Parent/Carer Support re activities/ events	The school staff will continually review and plan new events and activities, ensuring the best learning outcomes for the children. Parents/carers will be notified and assistance requested when necessary eg cooking demos, STEM Week.
3. Educational Advice for Parents/Carers	The school will continue to offer advice to parents/carers re their child's learning and education targets. The new focus will be on offering advice via the school newsletters, on the website, via Twitter and the school app, with videos being posted on a school You Tube Channel
4. Showcase Events	The school will continue to offer the parents/carers opportunities to see the 'learning in action' throughout the school year. If parents/carers are unable to attend these events then the videos/photos will be posted on Twitter.
5. Self Evaluation	The school will review the KPS Parental Engagement Strategy and the action points before the end of June 2020. The KPS Parental Engagement Strategy will then be updated for Session 2020/21.
