Our very first values champion awarded in term 1 was **Brianna**





This nomination was made for showing empathy and kindness to all members of our class and for always showing our King's Oak Values in class and in the playground.

<p data-bbox="118 176 430 241">Language and Literacy including French</p> 	<p data-bbox="459 176 1479 271"><u>Reading</u> - This term, we will be continuing to develop our skills in reading comprehension and reciprocal reading. In addition to this, we will develop our understanding of genres as well as discussing new and unknown authors and sharing our opinions about their writing style.</p> <p data-bbox="459 275 1479 398"><u>Writing</u> – This term we will have a strong focus on writing to: persuade, evaluate, explore issues and/or express our opinions. We will be continuing to work hard to make sure that we punctuate our writing correctly. We will also become confident in checking and editing our own work to ensure it meets the success criteria and makes sense.</p> <p data-bbox="459 403 1479 526"><u>Talking and Listening</u> - We will have many opportunities this term to talk in our pairs and as a class. We will become skilled at justifying our views on writers' style. Through listening and watching we will also learn interesting and technical vocabulary that we will confidently apply and use in new contexts.</p> <p data-bbox="459 530 1479 595"><u>Arabic</u> - This term, we will continue with our Discovering the Arabic World programme, learning about Arabic culture and language.</p>

In addition to this, we will be continuing to work on place value, number operations and building our mental agility.</p>

Some have also opted in to football training with Active Schools.</p>

We will be exploring all aspects of the polar regions from geography to wildlife to human society. Pupils will explore the effects of global warming on the polar regions when learning about renewable and non-renewable energy in science and how this affects our planet. We will watch some episodes of Frozen Planet to support our learning as well as learning how to construct an igloo and why this is a vital survival skill in some parts of the world. We will also consolidate our learning in art by exploring the work of Ted Harrison and translating polar region scenes onto paper using a range of media.</p> <p data-bbox="459 1301 1479 1366">Children will continue to receive religious input during monthly assemblies by Fraser and Andy, our pastoral care team.</p> <p data-bbox="459 1400 1479 1464">In class, we will learn about the meaning of Christmas and Christianity, and explore the ancient origins of many traditions that survive today.</p>
