## Children's Rights

On 16<sup>th</sup> July 2024, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) was incorporated into Scots law.

Our focus this week will be on Article 27:



UNCRC Article 27

I have the right to have a proper home, food and clothing

Our Rights Respecting word of the week this week is: 'Unconditional' meaning rights are a legal entitlement and do not need to be earned. Children do not need to have any responsibilities or behave in a certain way to have rights. Over November our Rights Respecting vocabulary words will be:

**United Nations Conventions on the Rights of the Child.** (UNCRC) - The UNCRC is a legal treaty. It sets out the rights that all children are entitled to.

**UNICEF** - UNICEF is the United Nations Children's Fund. UNICEF works in over 190 countries to save children's right to help fulfil their full potential.

**Universal** - The rights apply to all children everywhere. Children do not need to be citizens of a country to have these rights.

**Dignity** - Dignity means being valued and respected for what you are, what you believe in and how you live your life.

## Purple Day for Ardgowan Hospice

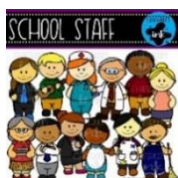

30 <sup>th</sup> September 2025	<b><u>Helping your child manage their anxiety at home</u></b> This session will give a brief overview of anxiety, potential anxiety patterns and provide strategies and tips to help you support your child.
21 <sup>st</sup> October 2025	<b><u>All behaviour is communication: challenging behaviour</u></b> This session will provide an overview of some 'big behaviours' and tools for you to communicate with your child and help to manage this at home.

16 <sup>th</sup> December 2025	<b><u>Internet Safety</u></b> This session is a general information session regarding internet safety for your child and how you can help ensure they are using the internet safely at home.
