On 16th July 2024, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) was incorporated into Scots law.

Our focus this week will be on Artcle 1: All children under 18 have rights.

Our Rights Respecting word of the week this week is: 'Fairnesss/ Equity' meaning everyone is different and have different needs. This might mean that some people require different opportunities or experiences to help them succeed.



Equity means that everyone requires the appropriate support that they need to succeed, rather than everyone receiving the same support.

Our Word of the Week across December are:

Global Citizens - A global citizen is someone who wants to make the world a safer, fairer and more sustainable place. There are 17 Global Goals. These goals encourage people to take action to help the world be a better place.

Inalienable (not to be taken away) - Rights cannot be taken away from people. They may not always be respected, but no one can take away a right from someone else.
