Homework: Homework Folders are issued each Monday including a Parent's Newsletter outlining the learning and homework activities for that week. Homework Folders will be collected in by the class teacher on a Friday and reissued the following Monday.

Reading should be practised every night to be heard in class. Reading books should be kept in school bags for use in class and will be collected in by the class teacher on a Thursday.

- **Phonics:** developing the reading, writing and spelling of different letter groups and words (e.g. ay, ea, ow, ue, aw, oi, au, ew, ow, ou, igh, y, magic 'e', ss, ll, ff, kn, mb)
- Spelling common words
- Continue to develop an interest in reading and the written text
- Reading Skills - inference, prediction, sequencing, retrieval and vocabulary
- Writing across different genres - personal, imaginative and functional
- Punctuation - capital letters, full stops, question marks and commas
- Grammar - nouns, pronouns, verbs and adjectives
