The Higher Human Biology class recently visited Strathclyde University to take part in a PCR workshop. The PCR process amplifies DNA samples then electrophoresis is used to compare the results. Pupils analysed the samples of DNA to identify the presence of rhesus antibodies.

S2 science pupils are learning about static electricity. Pupils have had fun with charging objects and seeing that we can use electrostatics to make objects move. Pupils had a race in class to see who could get their empty can to roll across the classroom using a charged rod to attract the can.
