Parent Council Update

The Parent Council has had a great start to the year with a healthy committee, although there is always room for more! We have contributed to the School Values refresh and also been involved in giving feedback on the Pupil School Improvement Plan. This version of the Improvement Plan was presented to us at the last meeting by the Pupil School Improvement Group themselves and is designed to get rid of all the jargon that runs through the School Improvement Plan so that everyone understands the aims of the school without having to check Google every two minutes to find out what SIP and SPLT mean! Look out for the new version coming your way, your Young People have worked hard on this.

As well as having our voice heard the Parent Council have also supported the school with a Departmental Bid system. Departments can bid for up to £400 to support a project that they think will benefit our young people. So far this year we have approved the following:

Cameron S performed a selection of songs at Greenock Town Hall on Saturday for the Greenock Burns Club coffee morning.










